UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1920-1928, AND WIDOWS', ORPHANS' AND OLD AGE CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1925.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice that Regulations have been made under the above-mentioned Acts amending the Unemployment Insurance (Mercantile Marine) (Collection of Contributions) Regulations, 1921, and the Contributory Pensions and Unemployment Insurance (Collection of Contributions for persons over sixty-five) Regulations (Northern Ireland), 1928, in the matter of the payment of Unemployment Insurance contributions in respect of foreign-domiciled seaman, and persons of the age of sixty-five and upwards employed in foreign-going ships.

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

PUBLIC HEALTH (PRESERVATIVES, Etc. IN FOOD) (NORTHERN IRELAND) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1929.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, the Public Health Act, 1896, the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1896, the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and the Butter and Margarine Act, 1907, and of every other power

enabling the Ministry in that behalf, has made further Regulations regarding the use of Preservatives, etc., in Food in Northern Ireland.

The object of these Regulations is to postpone, for a further period of one year, the operation of the Public Health (Preservatives, etc., in Food) (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1927, in so far as they prohibit the use of preservative in cream or in any article of food in which preservative is necessarily introduced by the use in its preparation of preserved cream.

Investing Council with Urban Powers in regard to Markets:

THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR NORTHERN IRELAND.

RURAL DISTRICT OF ANTRIM.

To the Council of the Administrative County of Antrim; to the Rural District Council of the Rural District of Antrim; and to all others whom it may concern:

WHEREAS by Section 1 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1896, as adapted, it is enacted in effect that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry"), may on the application of the sanitary authority of any rural district, by order to be published in the Belfast Gazette, or in such other manner as the said Ministry may direct, declare any provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1890, in force in Urban Districts to be in force in such Rural District or any contributory place therein, and may invest such authority with all or any of the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, and obligations of an Urban Authority under these Acts; and that such investment may be made either unconditionally or subject to any conditions to be specified by the Ministry as to the time, portion of the district, or manner, during at, and in which such powers, rights, duties, liabilities, capacities and obligations are to be exercised and attach:

And whereas it is enacted by Section 22 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, that all Urban Sanitary Authorities shall be called Urban District Councils, and that for every Rural Sanitary District there shall be a Rural District Council, whose district shall be called a Rural District:

And whereas it is enacted my sub-section (1) of Section 33 of the said Local Government Act that there shall be transferred to the District Council of any Rural District the business of the Rural Sanitary Authority in the District:

And whereas it is enacted in effect by Section 232 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, amongst other things, that an electoral division situated in a rural district is a contributory place:

And whereas the Council of the Rural District of Antrim (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") have made application to the Ministry under the said Section 1 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1896, for an Order declaring the provisions of Sections 103 and 104 of the said Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, in force in Urban Districts to be in force in the District Electoral Divisions of Antrim Urban and Antrim Rural in the said Rural District:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers vested in it by the Public Health (Ireland) Acts, 1878 to 1907, as adapted, and by all other statutes in this behalf enabling the Ministry, hereby orders, declares and determines as follows, that is to say:—The provisions of Sections 103 and 104 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, are declared to be in force within the District Electoral Divisions of Antrim Urban and Antrim Rural in the Rural District of Antrim; and subject to any conditions which the Ministry may hereafter deem fit to specify in the matter and to the provisions as to rating in Rural Districts of the Local

Government Acts (Northern Ireland), 1898 to 1929, the Council is hereby invested with all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities and obligations of an Urban District Council under Sections 103 and 104 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, to be exercised and attach within the limits or boundaries of the aforesaid area.
