THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1930.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (3) of section twenty of the National Health Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1930 (in this Order referred to as "the Act"), that the Act shall, except as otherwise expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day for the purposes of the Act shall be such day, not being earlier than the seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty, or later than the fifth day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, as the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council appoint either generally or with reference to any particular provision of the Act, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act:

And whereas it is expressly provided by the Act that certain provisions thereof, namely, section two, section ten and sub-section (4) of section sixteen of the Act, shall come into operation on the seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty:

Now we, the Lords Justices for the Government of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in exercise of all powers hereunto enabling us, do hereby order as follows:—

The tenth day of July, 1930, is hereby fixed to be the appointed day for the purpose of the provisions of the Act set out in the first column

of the Schedule to this Order, to the extent specified in the second column of that Schedule.

##### REPORTS OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

A "Report Charge" of 10s. (12s in the case of a call from the Isle of Man or Northern Ireland) is payable, in place of the normal charge, when for any reason beyond the control of the Post Office the person asked for cannot be found and connected with the caller. The hours during which calls may be made vary somewhat with the position of the ship, the service continuing each day for about 10 hours within the period 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. (British Time).

Calls may be booked only for a specified person, and the caller should give the name of the vessel and the name of the passenger with

whom conversation is desired, together with such further particulars as will enable him to be traced, as well as his own telephone number and the name associated with that number in the telephone directory.
