**STREET TRADING REGULATION ACT  
(NORTHERN IRELAND), 1929.**

NOTICE is Hereby Given that the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland have made an Order, dated the 11th instant, declaring all the Provisions of the above-mentioned Act in force in the town of Fintona, as from the date of the Order.

On and after the 11th day of October, 1930, it shall not be lawful for any person to sell or expose or offer for sale any article or thing from or upon any vehicle, barrow or cart, stall or other receptacle occupying a stationary position at a place in the carriageway or footway of any street in the town of Fintona,

without a licence from the Omagh Rural District Council authorising such person to do so.

Any person requiring a licence under this Act shall make application in writing in the prescribed manner to the Council not later than the 15th day of September, 1930.
