THE NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1930.

WHEREAS it is provided by sub-section (3) of section twenty of the National Health Insurance Act (Northern Ireland), 1930 (in this Order referred to as "the Act"), that the Act shall, except as otherwise expressly provided, come into operation on the appointed day, and that the appointed day for the purposes of the Act shall be such day, not being earlier than the seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty, or later than the fifth day of January, nineteen hundred and thirtyone, as the Governor of Northern Ireland may

by Order in Council appoint either generally or with reference to any particular provision of the Act, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and for different provisions of the Act:

And Whereas by virtue of the Act certain provisions thereof came into operation on the seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty, and by an Order in Council made on the ninth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty, by the Lords Justices for the government of Northern Ireland the tenth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty, was fixed to be the appointed day for the purpose of certain other provisions of the Act set out in the schedule to the said Order, to the extent specified in that Schedule:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, do hereby order as follows:—

The first day of October, 1930, is hereby fixed to be the appointed day for all purposes and provisions of the Act, so far as the Act is not at the date of this Order in operation by virtue of any provision expressly made by the Act or by virtue of the Order in Council hereinbefore recited.

Given at the Council Chamber, Belfast, this twenty-fourth day of September, 1930.
