SUPREME COURT OF JUDICATURE OF NORTHERN IRELAND.

A vacancy exists for a Second Class Clerk in the Principal Probate Registry under the Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland. Salary for men, £120—£15—£300 a year, with bonus in addition (at present £120 carries £68). Salary for women, £100—£10—£250 a year, with bonus (at present £100 carries £62).

Candidates must have attained the age of 20, and must not have attained the age of 22 on 21st February next, but the upper age limit may be extended to 30 in the case of candidates with professional legal qualifications or experience of legal business, and to 50 in the case of certain categories of employees under the Supreme Court.

The regulations governing the competition to be held to fill this post, together with the forms on which applications must be made, may be obtained on request from the Secretary, Supreme Court of Judicature of Northern Ireland, Law Courts, Belfast. The latest date for the receipt of applications on the prescribed form is Saturday, 21st February, 1931.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS, 1924 to 1928, and NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1924 to 1930.

NOTICE is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, the Minister of Health, the Department of Health for Scotland, and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, with the approval of the Treasury and of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the National Health Insurance Acts, 1924 to 1928, and the National Health Insurance Acts (Northern Ireland), 1924 to 1930, to make Regulations

to amend the National Health Insurance (Approved Societies) Regulations, 1930;

And that on account of urgency the National Health Insurance Joint Committee, the Minister of Health, and the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made Regulations entitled the National Health Insurance (Approved Societies) Amendment Regulations, 1930, to come into force immediately as provisional regulations to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act;

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE (DEPOSIT CONTRIBUTORS) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1930.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that Regulations have been made under the National Health Insurance Acts (Northern Ireland), 1924 to 1930, and the Widows', Orphans, and Old Age Contributory Pensions Acts (Northern Ireland), 1925 and 1929, applying to Deposit Contributors certain of the provisions of those Acts relating to members of Approved Societies and prescribing the method of administration of the Deposit Contributors' Fund.
