Coming into operation 16th September 1991

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and citation

1. —(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on 16th September 1991 and may be cited as the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 1991.

(2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Inland Letter Post Scheme 1989 (Post Office Scheme L1/1989) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Inland Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1990 (Post Office Scheme L3/1990).

Registration of newspapers

2. In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 19 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amount "£6" shall be deleted and "£6.50" inserted in its place.

Compulsory registration

3. In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 37 of the Scheme, the amount "£22" shall be deleted and "£24" inserted in its place.

Compensation for certain other postal packets

4. In sub-paragraph (3) of paragraph 39 of the Scheme, the amount "£22" shall be deleted and "£24" inserted in its place.

Cash on delivery

5. —(1) In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 40 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amount "£1.25" shall be deleted and "£1.60" inserted in its place.

(2) In sub-paragraph (6) of paragraph 40 of the Scheme as subsequently amended, the amount "95p" shall be deleted and "£1.20" inserted in its place.
