CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922.

WHEREAS a monument is in process of erection close to the Village of Carrickmore, at the junction of Carrickmore and Loughmaccrory Roads, in the townland of Carrickmore and County of Tyrone.

And Whereas there is reason to suspect that the erection of the said monument would be of a character calculated to promote the objects of an unlawful association and to be prejudicial to the preservation of the peace or maintenance of order:

Now, Therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Act, by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by Regulation 8A., made under the said Act, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, Do Hereby Order and Direct that the said monument in process of erection be destroyed.

MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported metal spools for typewriter, adding machine and calculating machine ribbons to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.

Attention is called to the fact that, while under the provisions of the above Act the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
