Transfer of General Business

1. Notice is hereby given that Unionamerica Insurance Company Limited ("Unionamerica") applied to the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry on 23rd October, 1991, for his approval, pursuant to section 51 of the Insurance Companies Act 1982, to transfer to SOREMA (UK) Reinsurance Limited ("SOREMA") all of its rights and obligations under policies written by it in the course of technical risk insurance business carried on by it in the United Kingdom between 1st April, 1990 and 31st March, 1991, both dates inclusive through the agency of Continental Reinsurance Technical Risk Management Limited (which changed its name on 15th November 1990 to SOREMA (UK) Underwriting Management Limited).
