NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE AND CONTRIBUTORY PENSIONS COLLECTION of CONTRIBUTIONS AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1931.

The Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland hereby gives Notice that Regulations have been made under the National Health Insurance Act, 1924, and the Widows', Orphans' and Old Age Contributory Pensions Act (Northern Ireland), 1925, providing for the cessation of the issue of National Health and Pensions Insurance contribution cards by Post Offices, and for their issue by Employment Exchanges.

TAKE NOTICE that the said William Coates, claiming as tenant for life is proceeding to sell his Estate, comprising part of the lands of Ballymurphy, containing 2a. 1r. 22p., statute measure, situate in the Barony of Belfast Upper and County of Antrim, and other part of the said lands of Ballymurphy,

containing 40a. Or. 13p., statute measure, formerly situate in the said Barony and County, but now in the Parish of Shankill and County Borough of Belfast, to the tenant thereof, in fee simple, excepting and reserving thereout all mines of coal, whether opened or not, excepted by an Indenture of Lease, dated 1st May, 1824, and made between George Augustus, Marquis of Donegall, of the one part, and Joseph Stevenson and others of the other part, in the same manner as the same were excepted in an Incumbered Estates Court Conveyance, dated 26th July, 1856, of the lands in this matter and other lands to Victor Coates upon trust for William Coates, made in the matter of the Estate of the Marquis of Donegall, Owner, ex parte John Turner, Petitioner. And that the Land Purchase Commission, Northern Ireland, intend, without any further investigation of title, within Fourteen days from this date, unless some valid reason is shown in the meantime why they should not do so, to deal with the said William Coates as the owner of the said lands for all purposes other than the distribution of the Purchase Money or the payment of any percentage out of the Land Purchase Aid Fund established under the Irish Land Act, 1903.
