THE SEA FISH (SPECIFIED SEA AREAS) (REGULATION OF NETS AND OTHER FISHING GEAR) (VARIATION) ORDER 1992 (SI 1992 No. 1344)

This Order varies the Sea Fish (Specified Sea Areas) (Regulation of Nets and Other Fishing Gear) Order 1991 ("the principal Order") which regulates the carriage of certain nets and other fishing gear in British fishing boats registered in the United Kindgom in specified sea areas and restricts the manner in which such nets and gear may be used.

This Order is made in reliance on Article 14(1) of Council Regulation (EEC) No. 3094/86, laying down certain technical measures for the conservation of fishery resources (OJ No. L288 11.10.86, p.1), which authorises Member States to take certain national measures for the conservation and management of stocks.

The principal Order requires a square mesh panel complying with specified criteria to be incorporated in the nets of certain mesh sizes carried in, or used by, boats in part of ICES IIa (Norwegian Sea) or in ICES IV (North Sea), ICES VI (Rockall and West of Scotland) or ICES VIIa (Irish Sea). This Order alters those criteria in several respects. In particular, it widens the requirement for a square mesh panel in ICES VI south of 56° north latitude and changes the requirement for a square mesh panel in ICES VIIa, and for nephrops it extends the requirement for a square mesh panel from ICES VIIa to all parts of ICES VII (West of Ireland and Porcupine Bank, South Coast of Ireland, Bristol Channel and English Channel) (articles 5 and 8).

This Order extends the circumstances in which the codend and any extension piece of the nets are regulated (article 6), subject to exemptions (article 4). This Order also removes the prohibition on the carriage and use of strengthening bags and top-side chafers in the principal Order (article 7).

This Order also makes some consequential and drafting changes.

THE UNDERSIZED WHITING ORDER 1992 (SI 1992 No. 1212)

This Order prescribes a minimum size for the landing of whiting (Merlangius merlangus) in Great Britain (article 2(1)). There is an exemption from the minimum landing size for the landing of whiting from foreign boats (article 2(2)).

The Order also prescribes a minimum size for the sale of whiting (article 3(1)) and for the carriage of whiting on a British fishing boat (article 4(1)). There is an exemption from the minimum sale size for whiting which are landed from foreign boats (article 3(2)) and from the minimum size for whiting carried on board Btirish fishing boats in the case of unsorted whiting (article 4(2)).

The Order gives British sea-fishery officers further enforcement powers in relation to fishing boats (article 5). They already have powers under section 15(2) of the Sea Fish (Conservation) Act 1967, as amended by the Fisheries Act 1981, ("the 1967 Act") to seize any fish in respect of which an offence has been or is being committed under section 1(3) of the 1967 Act.

Offences and penalties are prescribed respectively by section 1(7) and (8) and section 11 of the 1967 Act.

This Order is made in reliance on Article 14(1) of Council Regulation (EEC) No. 3094/86 (OJ No. L288, 11.10.86, p.1), laying down certain technical measures for the conservation of fishery resources, which authorises Member States to take certain national measures for the conservation and management of stocks.

Notice is hereby given that the Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 and by Sections 66(1), 68(1), (1A) and 3, 69(1), (3), (6) and (7), 70(1), 73(3), 74(1), 74A, 84 and 86 of the Agriculture Act 1970 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, has made on 11th June, 1992, the Feeding Stuffs Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1992, (SR No. 270).

The Regulations will come into operation on 27th July, 1992.

GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE

POULTRY AND HATCHING EGGS FROM GREAT BRITAIN

The Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland in accordance with the terms of the above legislation hereby authorises subject to the conditions attaching to this licence the importation into Northern Ireland from Great Britain of hatching eggs and live poultry until further notice or unless the licence is revoked by the Department.

CONDITIONS ATTACHED TO GENERAL LICENCE DANI/GEN/92/48

- All landings of poultry and hatching eggs shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Diseases of Animals (Importation of Poultry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1965 and with the provisions of this licence.
- Each consignment must comply with the provisions of Council Directive 90/539 which includes the following:
 - (a) consignments must be accompanied by an export health certificate which shall be
 - contained in a single sheet of paper stating that the poultry or hatching eggs come from establishments approved under the Directive, and
 - signed by an official veterinarian of Great Britain on the day of loading;
 - (b) except for adult poultry intended for immediate slaughter and consignments of less than 20, the consignment must originate from premises approved by the competent veterinary authority of Great Britain;
 - (c) consignments of live poultry shall not be transported through areas infected by Newcastle Disease or Avian Influenza unless by motorway or rail;
 - (d) during transit, poultry and hatching eggs in consignments of 20 or more must not come into contact with other poultry not of the same health status;
 - (e) all live poultry must be conveyed without delay to their premises of destination;
 - (f) except for consignments of poultry for immediate slaughter or in batches of less than 20, the boxes and cages in which the poultry and hatching eggs travel must contain only the same species, category and type of poultry/egg.
- The crates, cages and vehicles in which consignments are transported must comply with the provisions of Directive 90/539.

- 4. In accordance with Article 12 of Council Directive 90/539 a supplementary health certificate shall be provided stating that consignments of hatching eggs and poultry meet the following conditions regarding Newcastle Disease.
 - (a) hatching eggs come from flocks which are:
 - not vaccinated against Newcastle Disease, or
 - vaccinated against Newcastle Disease using an inactivated vaccine, or
 - vaccinated against Newcastle Disease using a live vaccine, provided that vaccination has taken place at least 60 days before the collection of the hatching eggs;
 - (b) day-old chicks come from:
 - hatching eggs satisfying the conditions in (a),
 - a hatchery where working practices ensure that such eggs were incubated at completely separate times and locations from eggs not satisfying the conditions in (a);
 - (c) breeding and productive poultry must:
 - not be vaccinated against Newcastle Disease, and
 - have been isolated for 14 days before consignment, at either a holding or a quarantine station under the supervision of the official veterinarian. In this connection, no fowl at the holding of origin or quarantine station, as applicable, may have been vaccinated against Newcastle Disease during the 21 days preceding consignment and no bird which is not due for consignment may have entered the holding or the quarantine station during that time; in addition, no vaccination may be carried out in the quarantine stations, and
 - have undergone, during the 14 days preceding consignment, representative serological testing to detect Newcastle Disease antibodies with negative result;
 - (d) slaughter poultry come from flocks which:
 - if not vaccinated against Newcastle Disease, satisfy the requirement in the third indent of (c),
 - if vaccinated, have not been vaccinated with a live vaccine during the 30 days preceding consignment and have undergone, during the 14 days preceding consignment and on the basis of a representative sample, a test to isolate Newcastle Disease virus.

Note

Representative sampling for Newcastle Disease (4(c) and (d)) should be defined "sampling complying with detailed rules adopted in accordance with the procedure laid down in Article 32 of the Directive."

- 5. In accordance with Article 13 of Council Directive 90/539 a supplementary health certificate shall be provided stating that consignments of hatching eggs, day old chicks and, breeding and production domestic fowl which have not reached 16 weeks of age and breeding and production turkeys which have not reached 20 weeks of age must come from flocks which have been submitted at point of lay to the HI test for mycoplasma synovia with negative result. (10% of birds up to a maximum of 120 birds being tested. 4 HA units of antigen to be tested against a final serum dilution of 1 in 10).
- 6. In accordance with Article 13 of Council Directive 90/539 a supplementary health certificate shall be provided stating that all breeding and production domestic fowl more than 16 weeks of age and all breeding and production turkeys more than 20 weeks of age must have been submitted at point of lay to the H1 test for mycoplasma synovia with negative result. (10% of birds up to a maximum of 120 birds being tested. 4 HA units of antigen to be tested against a final serum dilution of 1 in 10.)

Note

Alternative programmes of monitoring for mycoplasma synovia may be submitted to DANI for agreement in advance of any import.

 In accordance with Article 14 of Council Directive 90/539 a supplementary health certificate shall be provided stating that turkey hatching eggs must come from flocks in which there has been no evidence of Turkey Rhinotracheitis within 90 days of export, turkey poults under 72 hours of age must come from flocks in which there has been no evidence of Turkey Rhinotracheitis during the life time of the flock and turkeys over 72 hours of age must be isolated for 14 days prior to consignment and subjected to a test by the ELISA method for the pneumovirus considered to cause Turkey Rhinotracheitis.

 Importers must give the Department of Agriculture 24 hours' notice in writing of the arrival of each consignment.

Definitions:

 (a) poultry includes domestic fowl, turkeys, ducks, geese, partridges, pheasants, quail, pigeons and guinea fowl reared or kept in captivity for breeding, the production of meat or eggs for consumption or for restocking supplies of game.

- (b) hatching eggs means eggs for incubation, laid by poultry defined in (a).
- (c) day old chicks means all poultry less than 72 hours old, not yet fed; except for Barbary ducks which may be fed.
- (d) breeding poultry means poultry 72 hours old or more, intended for the production of hatching eggs.
- (e) productive poultry shall mean poultry of 72 hours old or more reared for the production of meat and/or eggs for consumption (or for the restocking of supplies of game).
- (f) slaughter poultry means poultry sent direct to a slaughterhouse as soon as possible after arrival, and in any case within 72 hours.
- (g) member state means a member state of the European Community.

Works Programme

MAINTENANCE OF WATERCOURSES 1992/1993 (Supplementary List)

The Department of Agriculture for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice in pursuance of Regulation 5(1) of the Drainage (Environmental Assessment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1991 of proposed routine maintenance work on the watercourses listed below.

The work may include the following:

- 1. Removal of channel silt and/or aquatic weed growth, the latter by mechanical or other approved methods.
- 2. Removal of obstructions from the channel which restrict the free flow of water.
- 3. Clearing of debris from grilles, manholes and/or flap-valves.
- 4. Reconstruction, repair or protection of flood defences, revetments and watercourse structures.
- 5. Measures for the protection or rehabilitation of fishery, conservation, or other interests.

The works will be carried out using environmentally sensitive river engineering techniques devised in consultation with the Department's conservation advisers. This will fulfil the Department's commitment in its publication 'Drainage and the Environment' to minimise environmental damage and encourage regeneration by its drainage works.

The Department reserves the right to alter the maintenance programme.

Having determined that the proposed works are not, by reason amongst other things of their nature, size and location, likely to have significant environmental effects it is the Department's intention not to prepare an Environmental Statement.

In accordance with Regulation 5(1) (d) of the Regulations representations may be made in writing to the Department at the address given below, with regard to its intention not to prepare an Environmental Statement. The closing date for the receipt of representations is 7th August 1992.

The Department will consult with conservation and fisheries organisations on the works programme.

CONSUMER PROTECTION (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1987

The Department of Economic Development has made Regulations under the Consumer Protection (Northern Ireland) Order 1987 entitled the Price Indications (Bureaux de Change) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1992 (SR 1992 No. 272).

These Regulations apply to any individual or other body which carries on the business of a bureau de change in the course of which foreign currency is sold, or bought from consumers (as defined in Article 13(b) of the Consumer Protection (Northern Ireland) Order 1987), in exchange for sterling.

The Regulations regulate the manner in which a person who holds himself out as operating a bureau de change at any premises gives at those premises an indication to consumers of the rate at which business may be done (an "exchange rate indication") (regulation 3).

Exchange rate indications must state the terms on which transactions will be conducted and provide other information including any commission or other charges. However, where a consumer requests information about the terms on which a particular transaction will be conducted, only information relevant to that transaction need be given. When an exchange rate indication is given and there is to be an interval

between the placing of the order and the supply of the currency during which rates may change, particulars of how the exchange rate and any commission or other charges will be determined must be given before the order is placed (regulation 4). Special provision is made in relation to coin operated machines (regulation 7).

Exchange rate indications and related information are to be given clearly and prominently and either legibly or audibly (regulation 5).

The Regulations require that a receipt setting out the terms of the transaction must be provided to the consumer in all cases except that of a transaction conducted through a machine. The issue of receipts in the latter case is only required if the machine is designed to supply receipts and the consumer requests one, but is not required at all where the machine exchanges coins only (regulation 6).

An exchange rate indication must be accurate and no suggestion may be made that it is not to be relied on (regulation 8).

Any person who contravenes these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction on indictment, to a fine, or, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding the prescribed sum (currently £2,000) (regulation 9).

The Regulations come into operation on 20th July, 1992, except for the provision relating to the clarity etc. of statements accompanying exchange rate indications and the requirement to display corresponding rates for notes and travellers' cheques, both of which come into operation on 20th July, 1993 (regulation 1).
