## MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926. IMPORTED BUTTER.

A Draft of an Order in Council under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, to require

imported butter (including blends of butter consisting of or containing imported butter) to be marked with an indication of origin, has been laid before Parliament as required by Section 7 of the Act.

### AGRICULTURAL SUBJECTS.— TEACHERS IN.

REGULATIONS, dated 31st August, 1931, made by the Ministry of Agriculture, Northern Ireland, after consultation with the Ministry of Finance, under the provisions of Section 99 of the Education Act (Northern Ireland), 1923 (13 and 14 Geo. 5, Ch. 21). As applied by the Order, dated 29th day of May, 1925, of the Governor of Northern Ireland in Council, and laid before Parliament in accordance with the said provisions.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Regulations for Agricultural Teachers, 1925, Amending Regulations No. 2, 1931."
2. From and after the date on which these Regulations shall come into operation and effect and until the same shall be in due manner altered or revoked, the incremental portion of the salary of every teacher to whom the Regulations for Agricultural Teachers, Northern Ireland, 1925 (herein-
