Whereas the Department of the Environment (in this Order referred to as "the Department") is satisfied that a serious deficiency of supplies of water is threatened within the areas supplied by Caugh Hill water treatment works;

Now Therefore the Department, in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 36(1)(a) of the Water and Sewerage Services

(Northern Ireland) Order 1973(a) and now vested in it (b) and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

Citation and commencement

 This Order may be cited as the Owenbeg River (Temporary Abstraction) Order (Northern Ireland) 1995 and shall come into operation on 11th August, 1995.

Temporary abstraction of water

- The Department may take up to 10 megalitres of water per day from the Owenbeg River at a point 100 metres upstream of Aughlish Bridge, in the townland of Aughlish, County Londonderry, during the period of 3 months from 10th August, 1995.
