

IN THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE  
IN NORTHERN IRELAND.

KING'S BENCH DIVISION.—IN BANKRUPTCY.

In the Matter of **GERALD McCausland**, of 11 Dobbryn Street, Armagh, in the County of Armagh, Motor Agent, a bankrupt.

WHEREAS the said Gerald McCausland was adjudicated bankrupt by Order of this Court on the 2nd day of June, 1932, and whereas at a Composition Meeting held in this Matter on the 7th day of July, 1932, three-fifths in number and value of the Creditors, who had proved Debts to the amount of £20 and upwards, agreed to accept a Proposal of the Bankrupt, the terms whereof were reduced into writing as a Resolution or Agreement and signed by the Creditors, such proposal being in the words or figures following, that is to say:—"To pay a Composition of Twenty Shillings in the Pound on the amount of unsecured debts and on so much of his partly secured debts as may not be fully secured, payable in cash within one month from the date of the confirmation of this proposal by the Court, or within such extended time as the Court may allow," whereupon the Court was pleased to confirm the same.
