NOTICE OF DESIGNATION

Video Recordings Act 1984: Designation under section 4(4) of the Video Recordings Act 1984 of persons as the authority to determine the suitability of video works for classification – Notice by Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Whereas a proposal for the designation of Mr. Andreas Whittam Smith (President of the British Board of Film Classification) to replace The Earl of Harewood (outgoing President of the British Board of Film Classification) and The Lord Birkett of Ulverston (Vice-President of the British Board of Film Classification), under section 4(4) of the Video Recordings Act 1984, to join Miss Monica Louie Sims, OBE (Vice-President of the British Board of Film Classification) as the authority responsible for making arrangements for the matters specified in that Act were laid before Parliament on 18th December, 1997:

And whereas the period of forty days since the proposals were laid has now elapsed and no resolution has been passed by either House of Parliament that the proposed designation be not made:

And whereas in accordance with section 4(3) of the Act I am satisfied that adequate arrangements will be made for appeals in respect of the determinations described in that section:

In exercise of the power conferred upon me by section 4(4) of that Act I hereby designate Andreas Whittam Smith (President of the British Board of Film Classification) to replace The Earl of Harewood (outgoing President of the British Board of Film Classification) and The Lord Birkett of Ulverston (Vice-President of the British Board of Film Classification), and to join Miss Monica Louie Sims, OBE (Vice President of the British Board of Film Classification) as the authority responsible for making arrangements for the matters specified in that Act.
