 - (a) each consignment originating in Great Britain must be accompanied by an original health certificate in accordance with the terms of Commission Decision 95/388/EC, which must have been signed by a local Veterinary Inspector authorised by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food; or
 - (b) each consignment which has been imported from a Member State and has been stored in Great Britain must be accompanied by:
 - (i) a copy of the original health certificate, in accordance with Decision 95/388/EC; and
 - (ii) a certificate signed by a Veterinary Inspector authorised by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food. The certificate must state that the semen has been stored under veterinary supervision in premises approved by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in accordance with Directive 92/65/EEC.
 - (c) Each consignment of semen originating in a third country and stored in Great Britain must be accompanied by:
 - (i) a copy of the import licence issued by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food;
 - (ii) a copy of the original health certificate, in accordance with the terms of the licence at (i) above; and
 - (iii) a certificate signed by a Veterinary Inspector authorised by the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food. The certificate must state that the semen has been stored under veterinary supervision in premises approved by the Ministry of Agriculture Fisheries and Food, in accordance with Directive 92/65/EEC.

5. Consignees shall ensure that all documentation relating to consignments are retained by them for a period of at least 12 months from the date of importation.
6. This licence will remain valid until further notice or unless it is revoked by the Department.

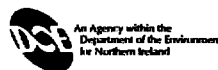
URBAN CLEARWAYS, PORTADOWN

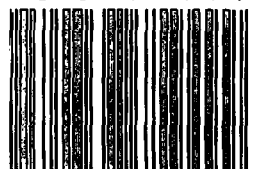
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
