PRINTING BLOCKS.

With reference to the notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast *Gazettes* of the 29th April, 1932, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of imported printing blocks, produced by photo process engraving, whether mounted or not, the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section 7, that a Report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid description of goods.

MINISTRY OF COMMERCE.

WHEREAS under sub-section (3) of section 1 of the Ministries of Northern Ireland Act, 1921 (N.I.), the Minister of Commerce may, if he thinks fit, by Minute to be laid before both Houses of Parliament, assign any specified powers or duties of the Ministry of Commerce (in this Minute referred to as "the Ministry") to such officer or officers as he may appoint to exercise or perform the same under any designation having reference to such powers or duties:

And whereas by Minute dated the first day of January, 1922, the Minister of Commerce assigned certain powers and duties of the Ministry as in the said Minute set forth and inter alia appointed Walter Abbott, Esquire, of the Ministry to be Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland for the purposes of the Business Names Act, 1916, and Registrar of Money-lenders for Northern Ireland for the purposes of the Money-lenders Acts, 1900 and 1911, and also appointed James Stewart, Esquire, of the Ministry to be Assistant Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland and Assistant Registrar of Money-lenders for Northern Ireland:

Now, I, the Right Honourable John Milne Barbour, Minister of Commerce for Northern Ireland, do hereby revoke the said

Minute of the first day of January, 1922, in so far as it is unrevoked, and do by this Minute:

(1) Assign the powers and duties of the Ministry in connection with the registration of Business Names under the said Act of 1916 to Walter Abbott, Esquire, O.B.E., and appoint—

- (a) the said Walter Abbott to exercise and perform these powers and duties under the designation of Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland;
- (b) Charles Magill Kirkpatrick, Esquire, M.B.E., of the Ministry to assist the said Walter Abbott in such exercise and performance under the designation of Assistant Registrar of Business Names for Northern Ireland:

(2) Assign the powers and duties of the Ministry in connection with the registration of Money-lenders under the said Acts of 1900 and 1911 to the said Walter Abbott, and appoint—

- (a) the said Walter Abbott to exercise and perform those powers and duties under the designation of Registrar of Money-lenders for Northern Ireland;
- (b) the said Charles Magill Kirkpatrick to assist the said Walter Abbott in such exercise and performance under the designation of Assistant Registrar of Money-lenders for Northern Ireland.

And I further declare that the aforesaid revocation, assignments and appointments shall have effect as from the second day of January, 1933.

MINISTRY OF COMMERCE.

WHEREAS by section 268 of the Companies Act (Northern Ireland), 1932, the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland is empowered to appoint such registrars, assistant registrars, clerks and servants as the Ministry thinks necessary for the registration of companies under that Act:

Now, therefore, the Ministry of Commerce hereby appoints Walter Abbott, Esquire, O.B.E., to be Registrar of Companies for Northern Ireland, and Charles Magill Kirkpatrick, Esquire, M.B.E., to be Assistant Registrar of Companies for Northern Ireland.
