

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3, hereby direct as follows:—

1. Article 2 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 3 Order, 1932, shall only apply to goods which were imported before the 9th day of July, 1932, and sold or exposed for sale before the 1st day of January, 1934, which do not bear an indication of origin applied to each article, as follows:—

(1) All classes of goods except rubber boots:

Stamped in a contrasting colour on the shank or heel or on the insole.

(2) Rubber boots:

Stamped in a contrasting colour on the shank or heel or on a label securely attached to each boot.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 1), 1933.
