And Whereas it is enacted by Section 22 of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898, that all Urban Sanitary Authorities shall be called Urban District Councils, and that for every Rural Sanitary District there shall be a Rural District Council whose district shall be called a Rural District:

And Whereas it is enacted by sub-section (1) of Section 33 of the said Local Government Act that there shall be transferred to the District Council of any Rural District

the business of the Rural Sanitary Authority in the District:

And Whereas it is enacted in effect by Section 232 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, as adapted, that special expenses (as defined in the said Section 232) shall be (amongst others) the expenses of lighting where duly authorised that special expenses shall be a separate charge on some contributory place or places; that such portions of any townland or townlands as may be determined by the Ministry of Home Affairs shall be contributory places; that the said Ministry shall have power to determine on what area of charge, being a contributory place or consisting of contributory places, any special expenses shall be chargeable:
