#### NOTICE UNDER ARTICLE 14(2) OF THE ELECTRICITY (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 1992

The Director General of Electricity Supply for Northern Ireland ("the Director") hereby gives notice pursuant to Article 14(2) of the Electricity (Northern Ireland) Order 1992 ("the Order") as follows.

The Director proposes to modify part of a paragraph of the Supply Competition Code. He proposes to modify the paragraph in order to (i) enhance the level of competition in the electricity market in Northern Ireland by increasing the number of consumers of electricity able to choose their supplier of electricity by decreasing the level of expected normal annual consumption in the definition of "eligible customer", (ii) remove the period of time during which the definition of "eligibility limit" remains.

- In order to achieve the above, the Director proposes to modify the paragraph of the Supply Competition Code so as to change the definition of "eligibility limit" at sub-paragraph 3.1 to:
  - decrease the level of expected normal annual consumption of electricity contained in the definition of eligibility limit from 1.675 gigawatt hours to 1.33 gigawatt hours; and
  - remove the period of time during which the definition of eligibility limit remains which is stated as being one year commencing 1st April 2000, and define the eligibility limit as being as of 1st October 2000.

- insert a new Part X to make provision concerning applications under sections 51A, 51C, 51D and 51F of the Judicature (Northern Ireland) Act 1978 (inserted by section 66 of the Criminal Procedure and Investigations Act 1996) which introduce a new statutory system for summoning a witness to attend the Crown Court; and
- correct existing numbering errors in the Rules.

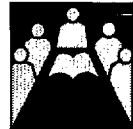
