Notice is given that the Department for Regional Development made the following Orders, on 18th July 2000 an Order entitled One-Way Traffic (Limavady) (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2000 (S.R. 2000 No. 236) which came into operation on 2nd August 2000. The effect of the Order is to provide a one-way traffic system in Massey Avenue, Limavady; and

on 2 August 2000 the On-Street Parking (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2000 (S.R. 2000 No. 252). The Order amends the On Street Parking Order (Northern Ireland) 1998 by extending the circumstances in which the use of a parking place may be suspended and deleting from Part 1 of Schedule 1 the entries relating to Charles Street South and Windsor Street, Belfast.

**Notice Of Intention To Make Abandonment Orders
Route B7 Chapel Hill Road, Mayobridge**

The Department for Regional Development being of the opinion that part of the above-mentioned road is not necessary for road traffic proposes to make an order under Article 68 of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993 the effect of which would be to abandon an area of approximately 313 square metres of road to the north-east of No 5 Route B7 Chapel Hill Road, Mayobridge in the townland of Mayo and County of Down.

Route A1 Dublin Road, Newry

HALFPENNY RIVER, LURGAN

The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development for Northern Ireland hereby gives Notice in pursuance of Article 12 (as amended) of the Drainage (Northern Ireland) Order 1973 that it proposes to carry out a drainage scheme on the Halfpenny River, Lurgan.

The Scheme is located between the downstream face of the culvert at Glenavon Lane and the junction with the Closet River at Kinnegoe Embankment. The scheme involves improvements to the watercourse as follows:

- To scour and cleanse the existing open channel.
- To replace 2 No. hydraulically inadequate accommodation bridges.

Having determined that the proposed works are not, by reason amongst other things of their nature, size and location, likely to have significant environmental effects it is the Department's intention not to prepare an Environmental Statement.

Any person who (i) considers that his interests will be prejudicially affected or (ii) wishes to make representations with regard to the Department's intention not to prepare an Environmental Statement, may send any observations in writing in regard to the scheme to:
