A PROCLAMATION
FOR APPOINTING WEDNESDAY,
JULY 12th, 1933, A BANK HOLIDAY
AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY IN
NORTHERN IRELAND.

I, JAMES ALBERT EDWARD, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland in pursuance of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, and the Irish Free State (Consequential Provisions) Act, 1922, and of every power me thereunto enabling, Do Hereby Appoint Wednesday, the Twelfth day of July next, as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday in Northern Ireland, under and in accordance with the said Acts, and I do, by this Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all loving subjects of His Majesty to order themselves accordingly.

GIVEN at Government House, Hillsborough, this twenty-fifth day of May, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-three.

MAKING OF REGULATIONS FOR PREVENTION OF CONTAMINATION OF FOOD.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 19th instant the Ministry of Home Affairs made Regulations in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, as amended by the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and other Acts, prescribing precautions to be observed by persons exposing food for sale with a view to preventing its being contaminated.

The Regulations are entitled "The Public Health (Prevention of Contamination of Food) (Belfast) (Northern Ireland) Regulations, 1933," and apply only in the County Borough of Belfast.
