CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL  
POWERS) ACT (NORTHERN  
IRELAND), 1922.

WHEREAS certain Regulations for peace and order in Northern Ireland are contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Act (Northern Ireland), 1922, and it is provided by Sub-section (3) of Section 1 of the said Act that the Minister of Home Affairs shall have power to make Regulations (a) for making further provision for the preservation of the peace and

maintenance of order, and (b) for varying or revoking any provision of the Regulations, whether contained in the said Schedule or made as aforesaid, and that any Regulations made as aforesaid shall, subject to the provisions of this Act, have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule:

Now, Therefore, I, The Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, do make the following Regulation for making further provision for the preservation of the peace and maintenance of order, and the said Regulation shall have effect and be enforced in like manner as Regulations contained in the said Schedule, and the said Regulation now made and the Regulations contained in the said Schedule shall have effect and be construed as if the said Regulation now made formed part of the said Regulations in the said Schedule, that is to say:—

Regulation 24 A., made pursuant to said Act, shall be amended as follows:—

The following organization shall be added to the list of organizations set out in Regulation 24 A. which, for the purposes of that Regulation, shall be deemed to be unlawful associations:—  
“The National Guard.”
