

## Experimental Traffic Control Scheme Eglinton Street And Sandhill Drive, Portrush

Notice is given that the Department for Regional Development made on 20 February 2002, an Experimental Traffic Control Scheme to reintroduce two-way traffic on that part of Eglinton Street, Portrush, from its junction with Sandhill Drive to its junction with Crocknamack Road, and to permit buses to use the fire lane in Eglinton Avenue.

The provisions contained in Schedule 2 to the One-Way Traffic (Portrush) Order (Northern Ireland) 1979 relating to the aforementioned length of Eglinton Street, and Sandhill Drive are suspended while the experimental traffic control scheme is in force and the Control of Traffic (Portrush) Order (Northern Ireland) 1994 has been modified for the same period to permit buses to use the fire lane in Eglinton Avenue.

The Department will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Scheme should continue in force indefinitely.

Within the period of 6 months from 25 March 2002, any person may object to the making of a traffic regulation order for the purpose of continuing the provisions of the Scheme in force indefinitely.

Any such objection must be in writing, must give the grounds on which it is made and must be made to the Department at Roads Service, Northern Division, County Hall, Casterock Road, Coleraine BT51 3HS.
