NOTICE.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS
(NORTHERN IRELAND),
1920-1932.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY
(MARIA ARMSTRONG).

WHEREAS Maria Armstrong, M.B., B.S., of Audley Lodge, Ballymena, in the County

of Antrim, has been convicted of an offence under the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And Whereas the said Maria Armstrong cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of, or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, Therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1929, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, as applied by the Dangerous Drugs Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1929, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, I hereby give notice that I withdraw as from to-day's date from the said Maria Armstrong the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves, Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III. of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Maria Armstrong to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, as applied as aforesaid.
