RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT
(NORTHERN IRELAND).

Whereas by section sixty-one of the Supreme Court of Judicature Act (Ireland), 1877, as amended by section twelve of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Ireland) (No. 2) Act, 1897, as those enactments apply to the Supreme Court of Judicature in Northern Ireland, it is provided that upon the recommendation and with the concurrence of a majority of all the Judges of the said Supreme Court of Judicature for the time being (of which the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland shall be one), and one Barrister and one Solicitor (respectively practising in Northern Ireland) to be appointed for the purpose by the said Lord Chief

Justice, by writing under his hand for such time as may be specified by him, the Governor of Northern Ireland may by Order in Council make Rules of Court and alter and annul any Rules of Court made under the enactments hereinbefore mentioned and for the time being in force in Northern Ireland:

And whereas certain Rules of Court, entitled "The Rules of the Supreme Court (Ireland), 1905," are in force in Northern Ireland, as altered from time to time by the Lord Lieutenant and the said Governor by Order in Council:

And whereas a majority of all the Judges of the said Supreme Court of Judicature and the other persons upon whose recommendation the said Governor may make, alter or annul Rules of Court as respects Northern Ireland, present on the 16th day of May, 1933, at a meeting for that purpose held (of which majority the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland was one) have passed a resolution for the making of the Rules of Court set out in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now I, James Albert Edward, Duke of Abercorn, Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter, Knight of the Most Illustrious Order of Saint Patrick, Governor of Northern Ireland, by and with the advice of the Privy Council of Northern Ireland, in pursuance and by virtue of the enactments hereinbefore mentioned, and of all other powers enabling me in this behalf, and with the concurrence of a majority of all the Judges and the other persons hereinbefore mentioned and present at the meeting aforesaid, do hereby make the Rules of Court set out in the Schedule hereto.

And I do hereby order that the Rules made by this Order in Council shall take effect on and from the date hereof.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1925.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1933.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Regulations, that the Ministry hereby recognises for the purposes of items (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Amendment Regulations, i.e.,

(a) A severed part of the carcase of an animal (including the head or any part thereof, and the whole carcase without the head, but not including any part of the carcase of a pig which has been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared), from which no submaxillary, pre-scapular, precrucial, superficial inguinal, supra-mammary, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

(c) All edible parts of an animal other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase, (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings, and (iii) meat which has before importation been made ready for human consumption in the form of a sausage or other prepared or manufactured article of food, the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule to the Notice published by the Ministry of Health in the "London Gazette" of 29th August, 1933, as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter, and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat, or to the

package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate.

The Official Certificate hereby recognised is that of the following country:—

WIRELESS VALVES AND RECTIFYING
VALVES.

With reference to the notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 27th January, 1933, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of imported wireless valves and rectifying valves, the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section 7, that a Report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid descriptions of goods.

THE STRENGTH OF SPIRITS ASCERTAINMENT REGULATIONS, 1933, DATED AUGUST 31, 1933, MADE BY THE COMMISSIONERS OF CUSTOMS AND EXCISE UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1907 (7 EDW. 7, C. 13).

The Commissioners of Customs and Excise, in pursuance of Section 4 of the Finance Act, 1907, and paragraph 11 of the Excise Transfer Order, 1909 (a) hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. (1) The following means may be used for the purpose of ascertaining the strength of spirits:—

The specific gravity of the spirits shall

be determined and the strength of the spirits shall be taken to be the percentage of proof spirit corresponding in the deposited Tables to the specific gravity of the spirits as so determined.

For the purpose of the foregoing provision:—

The expression "specific gravity" means the ratio between the weight of a given volume of the spirits at a temperature of eighty degrees Fahrenheit and the weight of an equal volume of water at the same temperature; and

The expression "the deposited Tables," means certain Tables entitled, "Tables showing the relation between the specific Gravity of Spirits at 80° Fahrenheit, the $\frac{80}{80}$

corresponding Percentage of Proof Spirit and the Percentage of Alcohol by Weight," a copy of which has been signed by the Chairman of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise and deposited in the Office of the King's Remembrancer.

(2) Where the specific gravity of any spirits determined as aforesaid falls between any two consecutive numbers appearing in column I of the Tables an amount bearing the same proportion to the difference between the two numbers in column II corresponding to the two said numbers in column I, as the difference between the said specific gravity so determined and the lesser of the said two numbers in column I bears to the difference between the said two numbers in column I shall be deducted from the greater of the said two numbers in column II and the amount so determined shall be deemed to be the strength of the spirits.

2. These Regulations shall come into force on the eleventh day of September, 1933, and may be cited as the Strength of Spirits Ascertainment Regulations, 1933.
