Notice of Seizure of Goods under the Customs & Excise Management Act 1979

To the Owner of the following goods detained on the 10th day of December 2002.

- 2500 litres or thereabouts of hydrocarbon oil at 210 Upper Springfield Road, Hannahstown.

Pursuant to Section 139(6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 and paragraph (1) of the Schedule 3 thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that, by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 and enactments amending that Act, the aforesaid goods have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that:

The Scheme, which comes into force on 17th January 2003 changes the provisions for forwarding a letter, for the treatment of undeliverable letters and introduces a requirement for notifying large postings in advance.

ROYAL MAIL GROUP PLC INLAND LETTER POST (AMENDMENT No. 5) SCHEME 2002

Royal Mail Group plc ^(a) by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 89 of the POSTAL SERVICES ACT 2000 and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement, citation and interpretation

1. This Scheme shall come into operation on 17th January 2003 and may be cited as the Royal Mail Group plc Inland Letter Post (Amendment No. 5) Scheme 2002.
2. This Scheme shall be read as one with the Successor Postal Services Company Inland Letter Post Scheme 2001^(b) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post Scheme (Amendment No. 1) Scheme 2001, the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post Scheme (Amendment No. 2) Scheme 2001, the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post Scheme (Amendment No. 3) Scheme 2001 and the Consignia plc Inland Letter Post Scheme (Amendment No. 4) Scheme 2001.
3. A reference in this Scheme to the Successor Postal Services Company shall be read as a reference to Royal Mail Group plc.

Paragraph 6 Forwarding a letter

4. Paragraph 6.2 shall be deleted and the following substituted
"6.2 Except in the circumstances set out in paragraph 6.3 below, Royal Mail will not charge additional postage or fees for forwarding a letter that has been re-posted in accordance with paragraph 6.1 above."

Paragraph 8 A letter which will not be delivered

5. The title of paragraph 8 shall be deleted and substituted with the following
"8. Undeliverable and re-posted letters"
6. Paragraph 8.2.1 shall be deleted and paragraphs 8.2.2 to 8.2.6 shall be re-numbered 8.2.1 to 8.2.5.
7. Paragraph 8.3 shall be deleted and replaced with the following paragraph
"8.3 Royal Mail may, at its discretion, return a letter to sender from the delivery address, if it is re-posted by the addressee or any other person for any reason and the return address is written correctly and legibly on the cover or envelope and is an address in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man."
8. A new paragraph 8.4 shall be inserted as follows
"8.4 Where a letter is undeliverable and:
8.4.1 the sender's name and address in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man are legible on the cover or envelope, Royal Mail Group plc may return the letter to the sender unopened;
8.4.2 the letter was originally posted with a Printed Postage Impression and the sender's name and address are (a) not on the cover or envelope, or (b) they are illegible, or (c) the sender's name and address are on the cover or envelope but the address is outside the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, then the letter may be dealt with or disposed of at the discretion of Royal Mail Group plc;
8.4.3 the letter was not originally posted with a Printed Postage Impression and the sender's name and address are not on the cover or envelope, or they are illegible, then the letter may be opened. If the name and address of the sender are inside, and the address is in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, and the letter does not consist solely of advertising material, newspapers or magazines, then the letter may be returned to the sender. Otherwise the letter may be disposed of at the discretion of Royal Mail Group plc."
8. Paragraphs 8.4 and 8.5 shall be re-numbered 8.5 and 8.6 respectively. The reference to section 8.3 in the renumbered paragraph 8.5 shall be deleted and substituted with a reference to paragraph 8.4. The words "in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man" shall be inserted in renumbered paragraph 8.5.1 after the words "sender's name and address". The words "or if the sender's address is not in the United Kingdom, the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man" shall be inserted in renumbered paragraph 8.5.2 after the words "cover or envelope".

Paragraph 10 Paying Postage and Fees

9. Paragraph 10.1.4 shall be deleted and substituted with the following
"10.1.4 the letter is re-posted to be forwarded in accordance with paragraphs 6.1 and 6.2 of this Scheme or to be returned to sender in accordance with paragraph 8.3 of this Scheme."

Paragraph 13 Posting

10. A new paragraph 13.7 shall be added
"13.7 For mail which is posted with a Printed Postage Impression, Royal Mail Group plc will require not less than 24 hours' prior notice of any posting of a large volume of mail (which means 4,000 or more letters and/or 1,000 or more packets) or of a larger volume of mail than that usually posted by the sender under any arrangements he has with Royal Mail Group plc (which means an

additional 4,000 or more letters and/or an additional 1,000 or more packets). This notice must be given in the manner specified by Royal Mail Group plc from time to time. If this notice is not received, the posting will not be processed for despatch on the day of posting. For the purposes of this paragraph only, "letter" means a letter which is no larger than 240mm x 165mm and which is no thicker than 5mm and no thinner than 0.25mm in size and which weighs no more than 100g and a packet means any letter which is larger or heavier than this but is otherwise within the size and weight limits for a letter as set out in paragraph 16 of this Scheme."

Paragraph 15 Prohibitions and Restrictions

11. Paragraph 15.1 shall be deleted and the following substituted
 - 15.1 Royal Mail Group plc will not accept a letter that contains any of the following;
 - 15.1.1 Aerosols
 - 15.1.2 Alcoholic liquids with alcohol content higher than 70%
 - 15.1.3 Asbestos
 - 15.1.4 Batteries that are classed as dangerous goods by the latest edition of the International Civil Aviation Organization's Technical Instructions
 - 15.1.5 Butane lighters and refills
 - 15.1.6 Clinical and medical waste
 - 15.1.7 Flammable, non-flammable, toxic compressed gases
 - 15.1.8 Corrosives
 - 15.1.9 Counterfeit money or counterfeit postage stamps
 - 15.1.10 Drugs of any description, except those permitted under paragraph 15.2 below.
 - 15.1.11 Dry ice
 - 15.1.12 Environmental waste
 - 15.1.13 Explosives
 - 15.1.14 Filth
 - 15.1.15 Flammable liquids or solids
 - 15.1.16 Lottery tickets excepts for United Kingdom lottery tickets
 - 15.1.17 Indecent, obscene or offensive material
 - 15.1.18 Infectious substances listed by the World Health Organisation to be in risk group 4 and the group 3 substances listed in schedule 3 part 5 of the Control of Substances Hazardous to Health Regulations 1999 (COSHH)

- 15.2.11 All radioactive material and samples that are not classified as radioactive using Table 2-12 of the latest edition of the International Civil Aviation Organization's Technical Instructions.
- 15.2.12 Vaccines

Paragraph 30 Prepaid in Cash

13. Paragraph 30.2 shall be deleted and the following substituted

"30.2 The minimum postage value for letters that will be marked in this way on any one occasion must be at least equal to the postage for 500 Second Class letters at the first weight step. The letters must be in bundles of 50 in which each letter must be of equal weight and must be faced in the same direction. First and Second Class letters must be presented in separate bundles. A note must be provided to Royal Mail of the total number of First and Second Class letters to be marked."

CONDITIONS

1. Imports of birds under this General Licence must meet the conditions of Council Directive 92/65/EEC.
2. Birds must come from premises which have been registered by the competent authority in the Member State of origin under Article 4 of Council Directive 92/65/EEC.
3. Birds must be accompanied by a declaration, signed by the owner, containing at least the following three statements:
 - (a) that the birds do not, at the time of export show any obvious signs of disease;
 - (b) that the premises of origin is not subject to any animal health restrictions applied as a result of an outbreak of disease;
 - (c) that birds which have been imported from a third country have been resident for at least 30 days in an EU Member State and, at the time of export, are free of quarantine restrictions.
4. The birds must not come from a holding on which avian influenza has been diagnosed in the 30 days prior to export.

5. The birds must not come from a holding or an area subject to restrictions under measures to be applied to combat Newcastle disease.
6. Birds which have been imported from a third country must have completed a period of at least 30 days quarantine in an EU Member State.
7. The importer must give at least 24 hours notice in writing to the Divisional Veterinary Officer responsible for the place of destination, of his intention to import the birds, specifying the nature of the consignment, its anticipated date of arrival and the place of destination.

In the event of any condition of this licence not being complied with, or in the case of suspicion of disease, a veterinary inspector has powers under the Diseases of Animals (Importation of Poultry) Order (Northern Ireland) 1965 (as amended) to require the owner or person in charge of the birds to quarantine, re-export or destroy the consignment at the owner's expense.

1. Imports of psittacines under this General Licence must meet the conditions of Council Directive 92/65/EEC.
2. Psittacines must come from premises which have been registered by the competent authority in the Member State of origin under Article 4 of Council Directive 92/65/EEC.
3. Psittacines must be accompanied by a document, signed by an official veterinarian in the Member State of origin, containing at least the following three statements:
 - (a) that the psittacines do not come from premises, nor have been in contact with animals from premises, on which psittacosis (*Chlamydia psittaci*) has been diagnosed within the two months prior to export;
 - (b) that the psittacines do not come from premises on which avian influenza has been diagnosed in the 30 days prior to export;
 - (c) that the psittacines come from premises or an area not subject to restrictions under measures to be applied to combat Newcastle disease.
4. Psittacines which have been imported from a third country must have completed a period of at least 30 days quarantine in an EU Member State.
5. Psittacines must be individually identified by leg rings or microchips.
6. The importer must give at least 24 hours notice in writing to the Divisional Veterinary Officer responsible for the place of destination, of his intention to import the birds, specifying the nature of the consignment, its anticipated date of arrival and the place of destination.

Notes
