The following Letters Patent were signed by Her Majesty The Queen on the 24th April 2003 in respect of the **Mental Health (Care and Treatment) (Scotland) Bill 2003 asp 13**.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories Queen Head of the Commonwealth Defender of the Faith To Our trusty and well beloved the members of the Scottish Parliament.

#### Greeting:

FORASMUCH as a Bill has been passed by the Scottish Parliament and has been submitted to Us for Our Royal Assent by the Presiding Officer of the Scottish Parliament in accordance with the Scotland Act 1998 the short Title of which Bill is set forth in the Schedule hereto but that

Bill by virtue of the Scotland Act 1998 does not become an Act of the Scottish Parliament nor have effect in the Law without Our Royal Assent signified by Letters Patent under Our Scottish Seal (that is Our Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and used in Scotland in place of the Great Seal of Scotland) signed with Our own hand and recorded in the Register of the Great Seal We have therefore caused these Our Letters Patent to be made and have signed them and by them do give Our Royal Assent to that Bill Commanding also the Keeper of Our Scottish Seal to seal these Our Letters with that Seal.

#### *Notice of Seizure under the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979*

### Control of Pollution

#### *The Large Combustion Plant Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2003*

Note: The Scheme which follows this note has been made under section 89 of the Postal Services Act 2000 and amends the Successor Postal Services Company Overseas Letter Post Scheme 2001. The Scheme, which comes into operation on 8th May 2003 revises certain postage rates and fees.

**ROYAL MAIL GROUP PLC OVERSEAS LETTER POST (AMENDMENT No. 7) SCHEME 2003**

Made ..... 28th April 2003  
Coming into operation ..... 8th May 2003

Royal Mail Group plc<sup>(a)</sup> by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by section 89 of the Postal Services Act 2000 and all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

*Commencement, citation and interpretation*

1. (1) This Scheme shall come into operation on 8<sup>th</sup> May 2003 and may be cited as the Royal Mail Group plc Company Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 7) Scheme 2003.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Successor Postal Services Company Overseas Letter Post Scheme 2001<sup>(b)</sup> (hereinafter called "the Scheme"), as amended by the Consignia plc Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 2001<sup>(c)</sup>, the Consignia plc Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 2) Scheme 2001<sup>(d)</sup>, the Consignia plc Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 3) Scheme 2001<sup>(e)</sup>, the Consignia plc Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 4) Scheme 2002<sup>(f)</sup>, the Consignia plc Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 5) Scheme 2002<sup>(g)</sup> and the Royal Mail Group plc Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 6) Scheme 2002<sup>(h)</sup>.
2. A reference in the Scheme to the Successor Postal Services Company shall be read as a reference to Royal Mail Group plc.

*Air mail packets*

3. (1) Sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph 9 of the Scheme shall be deleted and the following substituted:  
“(a) on every aerogramme sold singly postage of 42p, on every pack of 6 aerogrammes postage of £2.30, on every pictorial aerogramme sold singly postage of 52p and on every pack of 6 pictorial aerogrammes postage of £2.85.”
- (2) In sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph 9 of the Scheme the amount of “19p” shall be deleted and “20p” inserted in its place.
- (3) In sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph 9 of the Scheme the amount of “£1.30” shall be deleted and “£1.35” inserted in its place.

*Compensation for certain other postal packets*

3.A. In sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 38 of the Scheme the amount of “£27” shall be deleted and “£28” inserted in its place.

Pursuant to rule 13 of the Competition Commission Appeal Tribunal Rules 2000 ("the Rules"), the Registrar gives notice of the receipt of an application, dated 17th April 2003, under section 46 of the Competition Act 1998 ("the Act") by Littlewoods Limited, of Sir John Moores Building, 100 Old Hall Street, Liverpool, L70 1AB ("the applicant") in respect of a decision (CP0480-01) taken by the Director General of Fair Trading ("the Director") and notified to the applicant on 19th February 2003, ("the Decision").

In the Decision the Director found that the applicant entered into price-fixing agreements and/or concerted practices with Hasbro UK Limited ('Hasbro') and Argos Limited that infringed section 2 ('the Chapter I prohibition') of the Act. The Director also found that there was a separate bilateral agreement between the applicant and Hasbro. The Director further found that the agreements and/or concerted practices in question sought to fix the price of certain Hasbro toys and games in the UK and that the agreements and/or concerted practices infringed the Chapter I prohibition between 1st March 2000 and some time between 15th May 2001 and 14th September 2001. For its infringement of the Chapter I prohibition of the Act the Director imposed a penalty of £5.37 million on the applicant.

The applicant seeks the following relief:

- (1) That the Decision be set aside;
- (2) Alternatively, that the penalty imposed upon the applicant be set aside or otherwise reduced;
- (3) That costs be awarded to the applicant.

In summary the principal grounds on which the applicant relies are that:

- (1) The Director erred in finding that the applicant was engaged in an agreement or concerted practice as described or at all. The applicant had no interest in catalogue retailing. At all material times the only company which was engaged in catalogue retailing was Littlewoods Retail Limited which is not the addressee of the Decision.
- (2) There is no or no sufficient evidence of an agreement or concerted practice as alleged or at all. The evidence relied upon by the Director is flimsy and insubstantial and does not bear upon the facts which in law, are needed to establish an agreement or concerted practice within the meaning of the Chapter I prohibition.
- (3) In any event the penalty imposed was unfair and disproportionate.

Any person who considers that he has sufficient interest in the outcome of the proceedings may make a request for permission to intervene in the proceedings, in accordance with rule 14 of the Rules.

Pursuant to Rule 13 of the Competition Commission Appeal Tribunal Rules 2000 ("the Rules"), the Registrar gives notice of the receipt of an application, dated 17th April 2003, under section 46 of the Competition Act 1998 ("the Act") by Argos Limited of Avebury, 489-499 Avebury Boulevard, Saxon Gate West, Central Milton Keynes, MK9 2NW ("the applicant") in respect of a decision (CP0480-01) taken by the Director General of Fair Trading and notified to the applicant on 19th February 2003, ("the Decision").

In the Decision the Director found that the applicant entered into price-fixing agreements and/or concerted practices with Hasbro UK Limited ('Hasbro') and Littlewoods Limited that infringed section 2 ('the Chapter I prohibition') of the Act. The Director also found that there was a bilateral agreement between the applicant and Hasbro. The Director further found that the agreements and/or concerted practices in question sought to fix the price of certain Hasbro toys and games in the UK and that the agreements and/or concerted practices infringed the Chapter I prohibition between 1st March 2000 and some time between 15th May 2001 and 14th September 2001. For its infringement of the Chapter I prohibition of the Act the Director imposed a penalty of £17.28 million on the applicant.

In its application the applicant seeks the following relief:

- (1) That the Decision be set aside;
- (2) Alternatively, that the level of the penalty should be reduced.

In its summary of the principal grounds on which it relies, the applicant states that:

- (a) The burden of proof is on the Director and he is required to prove his case on the basis of "strong and compelling evidence".
- (b) Whilst the Decision alleges a concerted practice ("knowing cooperation") at the overall level between Hasbro, Argos and Littlewoods, the finding of a bilateral arrangement between Hasbro and Argos rests solely on the allegation of an agreement (a "concurrence of wills").
- (c) In order to establish a concurrence of wills or know cooperation between Hasbro and Argos, the Director must provide evidence of the state of mind of relevant employees of Hasbro and Argos. The Decision contains no evidence, let alone strong and compelling evidence, of the state of mind of any relevant Argos employee.
- (d) The interview records of Hasbro employees upon which the Decision relies heavily are woefully inadequate from an evidential perspective. In particular, no proper record was kept, leading questions were used persistently and the level of questioning was hopelessly superficial.
- (e) In spite of the requests made by the Director to Argos under section 26 of the Act and the carrying out of a "dawn raid" at Argos's headquarters under section 27 of the Act, none of the documents relied upon in the Decision emanates from Argos (e.g. e-mails from Argos employees or internal Argos documents).
- (f) The Director wrongly discounted the overwhelming evidence available that, as a result of its takeover by Great Universal Stores Plc ("GUS") in April 1998, Argos independently adopted a general change in pricing policy whereby it sought to price goods at the market level, rather than seeking aggressively to undercut competitors.
- (g) The totality of the evidence relied upon by the Director falls far short of establishing a concurrence of wills or even knowing cooperation between relevant Hasbro and Argos employees to charge particular prices for particular products, or to price particular products at particular pricing levels (e.g. RRP or market prices)."
