TRADE BOARDS ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1923.

SHIRTMAKING TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established by the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland under powers conferred by the Trade Boards Act (Northern Ireland), 1923, for the Shirtmaking Trade in Northern Ireland as defined in the Schedule to the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking Trade, Northern Ireland) (Constitution, Proceedings and Meetings) Regulations, 1925, dated 16th June, 1925, hereby give notice that they propose

to vary minimum rates of wages for certain male workers.

On request to the Trade Board, particulars of the proposed variation of minimum rates and information as to their application will be given if, in the opinion of the Trade Board, the applicant is likely to be affected thereby.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to their proposals which may be lodged with them within fourteen days from the Twenty-fifth day of November, 1933. Of subjects 5 to 10, candidates must take two or three (not including more than one language) sufficient to give a maximum of 300 marks.

Admission to this Part of the competition will be restricted to those candidates (up to such number as may be determined by the Commissioners) who obtain the highest aggregate marks in Part I.

- Subject to compliance with the provisions of paragraphs 1, 2 and 3, candidates will be offered vacant appointments in the order in which they are finally placed in regard to their aggregate marks in Parts I and II of the competition. No candidate will be eligible for appointment who does not exhibit a reasonable standard of proficiency.
- No expenses in connection with attendance at any part of the competition will be allowed.
