#### *A Proclamation*

#### **DETERMINING THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGN FOR TWO-POUND COINS COMMEMORATING THE TWO HUNDRETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST STEAM POWERED LOCOMOTIVE**

ELIZABETH R

Whereas under section 3(1)(a), (b), (cc), (d) and (dd) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the denomination, design and dimensions of coins to be made at Our Mint, to determine the weight and composition of coins other than gold coins or coins of silver of Our Maundy money and the remedy to be allowed in the making of such coins and to determine the percentage of impurities which such coins may contain:

And Whereas under section 3(1) (f) and (ff) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation

to direct that coins made at Our Mint other than gold, silver, cupro-nickel and bronze coins shall be current and that any coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount:

And Whereas under section 6(2) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to prescribe the composition of the standard trial plates to be used for determining the justness of coins of a mixture of metals:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to order that, to commemorate the two-hundredth anniversary of the first steam-powered locomotive there should be made at Our Mint coins of the denomination of two pounds in gold, and in silver, and in cupro-nickel and nickel-brass, having joined concentric inner and outer sections, that is in gold with a different coloured gold outer section, in silver with a gold-plated outer section and in cupro-nickel and nickel-brass with a cupro-nickel inner section and a nickel-brass outer section.

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3(1)(a), (b), (cc), (d), (dd), (f) and (ff), the said section 6(2) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

#### **GOLD COIN**

1. (1) A new coin of gold of the denomination of two pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard diameter of 28.4 millimetres, being circular in shape and having joined concentric inner and outer sections.
- (2) Without prejudice to section 1(2) of the Coinage Act 1971, the inner and outer sections may consist of different alloys.

- (3) The approximate diameter of the inner section shall be 20 millimetres.

#### STANDARD SILVER COIN

2. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of two pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 12 grammes, and a standard diameter of 28.4 millimetres, and a standard composition (excluding the gold plate) of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy (that is, of 925 parts per thousand fine silver), circular in shape, and having joined concentric inner and outer sections, the outer section being plated with fine gold of a standard weight of plating of 0.065 grammes.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.095 grammes for the inner and outer sections;
- (b) a variation from the said standard weight of plating of an amount per coin of 0.045 grammes; and
- (c) in relation to those parts of the coin other than the gold plating, a variation from the said composition of five parts per thousand fine silver.
- (3) In the making of the said silver coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.125 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.
- (4) The approximate diameter of the inner section shall be 20 millimetres.
- (5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

#### SILVER PIEDFORT COIN

3. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of two pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 24 grammes, and a standard diameter of 28.4 millimetres, and a standard composition (excluding the gold plate) of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy (that is, of 925 parts per thousand fine silver), circular in shape, and having joined concentric inner and outer sections, the outer section being plated with fine gold of a standard weight of plating of 0.085 grammes.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.145 grammes for the inner and outer sections;
- (b) a variation from the said standard weight of plating of an amount per coin of 0.045 grammes;
- (c) in relation to those parts of the coin other than the gold plating, a variation from the said composition of five parts per thousand fine silver.
- (3) In the making of the said silver coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.125 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.
- (4) The approximate diameter of the inner section shall be 20 millimetres.
- (5) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

#### CUPRO-NICKEL AND NICKEL-BRASS COIN

4. (1) A new coin of cupro-nickel and nickel-brass of the denomination of two pounds shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 12 grammes, a standard diameter of 28.4 millimetres, circular in shape and having joined concentric inner and outer sections, with a standard composition as to the inner section of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel, and as to the outer section of seventy-six per centum copper, four per centum nickel and twenty per centum zinc.
- (2) In the making of the said cupro-nickel and nickel-brass coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.1 grammes for the inner and outer sections; and

- (b) a variation from the said standard composition as to the inner section of two per centum copper and two per centum nickel, and as to the outer section of two per centum copper, three-quarters of one per centum nickel and two per centum zinc.

- (3) In the making of the said cupro-nickel and nickel-brass coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.1 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.
- (4) The approximate diameter of the inner section shall be 20 millimetres.
- (5) The inner and outer sections of the said coin may contain impurities of 0.75 of one per centum.
- (6) The said cupro-nickel and nickel-brass coin shall be current and shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.
- (7) The composition of the standard trial plates to be used for determining the justness of the nickel-brass outer section of the said coin shall be pure copper, pure nickel and pure zinc.

#### DESIGN OF THE COINS

5. The design of the said coins shall be as follows:
- “For the obverse impression Our effigy with the circumscription ‘ELIZABETH · II · DEI · GRA · REG · FID · DEF’, and for the reverse a representation of a locomotive engine with the words ‘TWO POUNDS’ above and the whole inside a cog wheel, and the words ‘R. TREVITHICK 1804 INVENTION · INDUSTRY · PROGRESS 2004’ as a circumscription. The coins shall have a graining upon the edge and an incuse arched railway line motif, save for the gold coin where the arched railway line motif will be accompanied by a plain edge.”
6. This Proclamation shall come into force on the ninth day of October Two thousand and three.

#### DETERMINING THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGN OF A NEW SERIES OF ONE POUND COINS OF SILVER AND OF NICKEL-BRASS

ELIZABETH R

Whereas under section 3(1)(a), (b), (cc), (d) and (dd), of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the denomination, design and dimensions of any coins to be made at Our Mint, to determine the weight and composition of coins other than gold coins and coins of silver of Our Maundy money and the remedy to be allowed in the making of such coins and to determine the percentage of impurities that such coins may contain:

And Whereas under section 3(1)(f) and (ff) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to direct that coins made at Our Mint other than gold, silver, cupro-nickel and bronze coins shall be current and that any coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount:

And Whereas under section 6(2) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to prescribe the composition of standard trial plates to be used for determining the justness of coins of a mixture of metals:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to order that new coins of silver and of nickel-brass of the denomination of one pound should be made at Our Mint:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3(1)(a), (b), (cc), (d), (dd), (f) and (ff), the said section 6(2) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

#### STANDARD SILVER COIN

1. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of one pound shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 9.5 grammes, a standard diameter of 22.5 millimetres and a standard composition of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, (that is, of 925 parts per thousand fine silver), and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.5 grammes; and

- (b) a variation from the said standard composition of five parts per thousand fine silver.
- (3) In the making of the said silver coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.1 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.
- (4) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

**SILVER PIEDFORT COIN**

- 2. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of one pound shall be made being a coin of a standard weight of 19 grammes, a standard diameter of 22.5 millimetres, and a standard composition of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, (that is, 925 parts per thousand fine silver), and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight and composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following that is to say:-
  - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.5 grammes; and
  - (b) a variation from the said standard composition of five parts per thousand fine silver.
- (3) In the making of the said silver coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.1 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.
- (4) The said silver coin shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.

**NICKEL-BRASS COIN**

- 3. (1) A new coin of nickel-brass of the denomination of one pound shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 9.5 grammes, a standard diameter of 22.5 millimetre, and a standard composition of seventy per centum copper, five and one half per centum nickel and twenty four and one half per centum zinc, and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said nickel-brass coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:-
  - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.5 grammes; and
  - (b) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum copper, three-quarters of one per centum nickel and two per centum zinc.
- (3) In the making of the said nickel-brass coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.1 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.
- (4) The said nickel-brass coin may contain impurities of 0.75 of one per centum.
- (5) The said coin shall be current and shall be legal tender for payment of any amount in any part of Our United Kingdom.
- (6) The composition of the standard trial plates to be used for determining the justness of the said coin shall be pure copper, pure nickel and pure zinc.

**DESIGN OF THE COINS**

- 4. The design of the said coins shall be as follows:-  
 "For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription 'ELIZABETH · II · D · G REG · F · D ·' and the date of the year, and for the reverse either –
  - (a) a representation of the Gateshead Millennium bridge with a border of struts;
  - (b) a representation of the Forth Railway bridge with a border of railway tracks;
  - (c) a representation of the Menai Straits bridge with a border of railings and stanchions; or
  - (d) a representation of the Egyptian arch railway bridge in County Down with a border of railway station canopy dags

and beneath the same the words "ONE POUND". The coins shall have a graining upon the edge and an incuse decorative feature symbolising bridges and pathways."

- 5. This Proclamation shall come into force on the ninth day of October Two thousand and three.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this eighth day of October in the year of our Lord Two thousand and three and in the fifty-second year of Our Reign.

**DETERMINING THE SPECIFICATIONS AND DESIGN FOR FIFTY PENCE COINS COMMEMORATING THE FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST FOUR-MINUTE MILE**

Whereas under section 3(1)(a), (b), (c), (cc) and (d) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the denomination, design and dimensions, of coins to be made at Our Mint, to determine the weight and fineness of certain gold coins, the remedy to be allowed in the making of such coins and their least current weight, and to determine the weight and composition of coins other than gold coins and coins of silver of Our Maundy money and the remedy to be allowed in the making of such coins:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to order that, to commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the running of the first four-minute mile there should be made at Our Mint in gold, in silver and in cupro-nickel, coins of the denomination of fifty pence:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3(1)(a), (b), (c), (cc) and (d) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

**GOLD COIN**

- 1. (1) A new coin of gold of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 15.5 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and of millesimal fineness 916.66, and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
- (2) In the making of the said gold coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or fineness specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
  - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin of 0.065 grammes; and
  - (b) a variation from the said millesimal fineness of two per mille.
- (3) The least current weight of the said gold coin shall be 15.4 grammes.
- (4) In the making of the said gold coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.125 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.

**STANDARD SILVER COIN**

- 2. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 8 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and a standard composition of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy (that is, of 925 parts per thousand fine silver), and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
  - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.075 grammes; and
  - (b) a variation from the said composition of five parts per thousand fine silver.
- (3) In the making of the said silver coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.125 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.

**SILVER PIEDFORT COIN**

- 3. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 16 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and a standard composition of thirty-seven-fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy (that is, of 925 parts per thousand fine silver), and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
  - (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.095 grammes; and
  - (b) a variation from the said composition of five parts per thousand fine silver.
- (3) In the making of the said silver coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.125 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.

## CUPRO-NICKEL COIN

4. (1) A new coin of cupro-nickel of the denomination of fifty pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 8 grammes, a standard diameter of 27.3 millimetres, and a standard composition of seventy-five per centum copper and twenty-five per centum nickel, and being in the shape of an equilateral curve heptagon.
- (2) In the making of the said cupro-nickel coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight or composition specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.045 grammes; and
- (b) a variation from the said standard composition of two per centum.
- (3) In the making of the said cupro-nickel coin a variation from the said standard diameter of not more than 0.125 millimetres per coin shall be allowed.

## DESIGN OF THE COINS

5. The design of the said coins shall be as follows:  
 "For the obverse impression Our effigy with the circumscription 'ELIZABETH · II · D · G REG · F · D ·', and the date of the year, and for the reverse the legs of a running athlete with a stylised stopwatch in the background and below the value '50 PENCE'. The coins shall have a plain edge."
6. This Proclamation shall come into force on the ninth day of October Two thousand and three.

### PRESENT, THE QUEEN'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by the Civil Service Commissioners (Northern Ireland) Order 1999 (a) provision was made relating to the functions of the Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland and the appointment of persons to situations in the Northern Ireland Civil Service;

*Title and commencement*

1. This Order may be cited as the Civil Service Commissioners (Amendment) (Northern Ireland) Order in Council 2003 and shall come into operation forthwith.

*Interpretation*

2. (1) The Interpretation Act (Northern Ireland) 1954 (b) shall apply to this Order as if it were an enactment within the meaning of section 1(b) of that Act.
- (2) In this Order expressions which are also used in the Civil Service Commissioners (Northern Ireland) Order 1999 ("the principal Order") shall have the same meaning as in that Order.

*Amendment of the principal Order*

3. In Article 3(2)(b) of the principal Order for the words "next dissolution of the New Northern Ireland Assembly" there shall be substituted "date on which the relevant member ceases to hold office".

## Department of the Environment

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule entitled **Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) (Amendment No. 3) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2003** (S.R. 2003 No. 431).

These Regulations, which come into operation on 1st November 2003, further amend the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 1999 (the "principal Regulations") by amending the definition of "the emissions publication" in Schedule 10 to the 1999 Regulations so as to refer to the most recent (i.e. the ninth) edition of the publication entitled "In Service Exhaust Emission Standards for Road Vehicles".

The publication specifies, with respect to vehicles with spark ignition engines, the maximum permitted carbon monoxide content of exhaust emissions at idling speed and the limits for the ratio of air to petrol vapour entering the combustion chamber, in relation to each of the vehicle models named in the publication.

These Regulations have been notified to the European Commission pursuant to European Parliament and Council Directive 98/34/EC of 22nd June 1998, laying down a procedure for the provision of information in the field of technical standards and regulations (O.J.No.L204,21.7.98,p.37).

- A description of the purposes for which the Electronic Communications Network (if applicable) is to be used, for example the type of Electronic Communications Service to be Provided over the Network and who is likely to benefit from that Service;
- In the case of Providers of systems of Conduits only, written evidence that they are making available or proposing to make available their system of Conduits for use by Providers of Electronic Communications Networks for the purposes of the provision by those Providers of their Networks (e.g. any available contracts, letters from Providers of Electronic Communications Networks confirming their intention of using that specific system of Conduits for the Provision of their Networks);
- Where the Applicant is able and willing to share Electronic Communications Apparatus, evidence of his ability and willingness to share such Apparatus;
- Where applicable, a description of alternative arrangements to the direction applying the Electronic Communications Code which have been sought;
- Where available, a description of any measures taken or initiatives signed up to which demonstrate responsible use by the Applicant of the Electronic Communications Code; and
- Evidence of the Applicant's ability to put in place funds for meeting liabilities as defined in restrictions and conditions referred to in sections 109 to 117 of the Act prior to the exercise of rights conferred by the Electronic Communications Code.

##### Manner

3. In accordance with section 395(3) of the Act the Director is willing to receive applications for a direction under section 106 of the Act transmitted by means of an Electronic Communications Network.

4. Words or expressions used in this Notification shall have the same meaning as in the Act.

#### REVISED STATEMENT OF CHARGING PRINCIPLES PUBLISHED BY THE DIRECTOR GENERAL OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS ON 10TH OCTOBER 2003 FOR THE PURPOSE OF FIXING CHARGES IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTIONS 38 AND 39 OF THE COMMUNICATIONS ACT 2003

##### Explanatory Memorandum

Part 2 of Annex A sets out the Charging Principles levied on communications providers and those making available associated facilities with a turnover of £5million or more from relevant activities who are required to pay administrative charges in accordance with sections 38 and 39 of the Communications Act 2003. The Charging Principles in Part 2 of Annex A replace the Charging Principles that were published by the Director General of Telecommunications ('the Director') on 25th July 2003, for the purposes of the administrative charges.

Part 3 of Annex A sets out for the first time the Charging Principles levied only on persons to whom the Electronic Communications Code ('the Code') applies in accordance with sections 38 and 39 of the Communications Act 2003. The Charging Principles in Part 3 explains the way charges will be fixed every charging year for covering the

Director's costs in administering the Code and dealing with successful Code applications. Therefore, persons with code powers and prospective Code Applicants should take into account the Charging Principles in Part 3 of Annex A for the purposes of the code charges.

The turnover bands in Part 2 of Annex A are applicable **only** to persons liable to pay administrative charges for the provision of electronic communications networks, electronic communications services and associated facilities. They do not apply to persons with code powers and prospective Code Applicants who are liable to pay charges to cover the Director's costs in administering the Code and dealing with successful Code applications.

#### 1. Definitions

1. For the purposes of interpreting these Charging Principles the following definitions shall apply:-

'Act' means the Communications Act 2003;

'Director' means the Director General of Telecommunications as appointed under section 1 of the Telecommunications Act 1984;

'Electronic Communications Code' has the same meaning as in section 106(1) of the Act;

'First Charging Year' means the period beginning with 25th July 2003 and ending on 31st March 2004;

'Relevant Activity' means any of the following:

a. the provision of Public Electronic Communications Services to end-users;

b. the provision of Electronic Communications Networks, Electronic Communications Services and Network Access to Communications Providers; or

c. the making available of Associated Facilities to Communications Providers;

'Relevant Person' means a person providing a designated Electronic Communications Network or Electronic Communications Service or making available a designated Associated Facility, such designations being contained in a Notice of Designation published by the Director under sections 38 and 34 of the Act on 25th July 2003 and 'Relevant Turnover' means

a. in the First Charging Year, the Turnover made by any Relevant Person in that Person's financial year ending in the period of 12 months ending on 24th July 2002;

b. in the Second Charging Year, the Turnover made by any Relevant Person in that Person's financial year ending in the period of 12 months ending on 24th July 2003; or

c. in any subsequent Charging Year, the Turnover made by any Relevant Person in that Person's financial year ending in the Charging Year immediately prior to the Charging Year before the Charging Year in question.

'Second Charging Year' means the period beginning with 1st April 2004 and ending on 31st March 2005.

'Turnover' means the turnover made from carrying on any Relevant Activity after the deduction of sales rebates, value added tax and other taxes directly related to turnover.

1.2 Except in so far as the context otherwise requires, words or expressions shall have the meaning assigned to them and otherwise any word or expression shall the same meaning as it has in the Act.

#### 2. Charging Principles for Relevant Persons

2.1 For the purposes of section 38 of the Act in any Charging Year the Director shall fix the administrative charge to be paid by each Relevant Person in the manner set out below.

2.2 The administrative charge to be paid by each Relevant Person shall be a percentage of either:

a. the lower figure of the turnover band determined by the Director to be applicable to each such person in accordance with sub paragraph 2.3; or

b. in any case where in accordance with sub paragraph 2.3 no turnover band has been determined to apply to any Relevant Person, that person's Relevant Turnover.

2.3 The Director shall determine the turnover band applicable to each Relevant Person by reference to the turnover bands in sub paragraph 2.7 below and the amount of Relevant Turnover notified to the Director by that person, save that no such applicable turnover band shall be determined by the Director where the Relevant Person's turnover is £1,000,000,000 or more.

2.4 The Director shall determine the percentage referred to in sub paragraph 2.2 by carrying out the calculation described in sub paragraph 2.5 below.

2.5 The Director shall:

a. take either the lower figure of the turnover band applicable to each person as determined in accordance with sub paragraph 2.3, or where in accordance with sub paragraph 2.3 no such turnover band applies, the total Relevant Turnover notified to the Director by that Relevant Person, and add all those amounts together;

b. divide the total amount of the Director's estimated annual costs of carrying out his functions set out in Section 38(5) of the Act (save for the functions referred to in paragraph 3 below) by the sum resulting from the calculation in paragraph (a); and

c. apply the quotient resulting from the calculation in paragraph (b) as the percentage.

2.6 The maximum percentage which may be applied by the Director under sub paragraph 2.2 shall be 0.08%.

2.7 The turnover bands for the purposes of fixing the administrative charges shall be as follows

2.8 In the First Charging Year only the Director shall make an appropriate reduction to the amount of each administrative charge payable to reflect the shorter length of that year.

#### 3. Charging Principles for persons to whom the Electronic Communications Code applies

3.1 For the purposes of section 38 of the Act in any Charging Year the Director shall fix the administrative charge to be paid by each person referred to in sub paragraphs 3.2 and 3.4 in the manner set out below.

3.2 Every person to whom the Electronic Communications Code applies on the first day of each Charging Year by virtue of a direction given under section 106 of the Act shall pay a charge calculated by taking the total amount of the Director's estimated costs of carrying out his functions listed in sub paragraph 3.3 below and dividing that amount by the total number of persons liable to pay a charge under this sub paragraph. In the case of the First Charging Year the Director shall make an appropriate reduction to the charge to reflect the shorter length of that Year.

3.3. The Director's functions referred to in sub paragraph 3.2 above are his functions under sections 108 to 119 of the Act and his functions under sections 38 - 43 of the Act insofar as they relate to administrative charges referred to in this paragraph.

3.4 Every person to whom a direction is given under section 106 of the Act in any particular Charging Year applying the Electronic Communications Code in that person's case shall pay a charge in that Year only which shall be calculated by estimating the costs in that Year of dealing with an application for the Electronic Communications Code under sections 106 and 107 of the Act.

4. All earlier statements of charging principles published under sections 38 and 39 of the Act are revoked. This statement shall come into force on the day it is published.
