AGRICULTURAL MARKETING.
PIGS.

The Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1934, dated fifteenth January, 1934, made by the Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, under section I. (4) of the Agricultural Marketing Act (Northern Ireland), 1933 (23 and 24 Geo. 5 Ch. 22).

The Ministry of Agriculture for Northern Ireland, after such consultation as is required by subsection (4) of section one of the Agricultural Marketing Act (Northern Ireland), 1933, and in exercise of the powers conferred on the said Ministry by the said subsection, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. The Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland), 1933, as approved by the Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Approval) Order, 1933, shall have effect with the following amendments:

(a) The following provision shall be added to paragraph 24 of the said Scheme at the end of that paragraph, that is to say: "As soon as possible after the last day for the receipt of nominations the Ministry shall publish the names and addresses of the candidates who have been duly nominated. A candidate may withdraw his candidature by sending to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture, Stormont, Belfast, by registered post, not later than the 25th day of January in the said year, a notice in writing of such withdrawal signed by him."

(b) Subdivision (a) of paragraph 28 of the said Scheme shall have effect as if for the words "Chartered or Incorporated Accountant" there were substituted the words "member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants or of the Society of Incorporated Accountants and Auditors or of the Corporation of Accountants, Limited, or of the London Association of Certified Accountants, Limited."

(c) The following provision shall be added to paragraph 30 of the said Scheme at the end of that paragraph, that is to say: "A person shall be deemed to sell pigs if he sells the carcase of any pigs, being pigs produced by him in Northern Ireland."

(d) Paragraph 33 of the said Scheme shall have effect as if subdivision (f) were deleted therefrom.

(e) Paragraph 40 of the said Scheme shall be modified to such extent as is necessary in order that the same may be read and have effect as follows:

"Upon the sale of any pigs by any producer to (i) a curer; or (ii) a person registered as a dealer in pigs under regulations made by the Ministry in pursuance of sub-section (1) (b) of paragraph referred to as a "registered dealer"; or (iii) the Board, that producer shall pay a contribution of such amount per pig as the Board, with the approval of the Ministry, may determine to be necessary for the operation of this Scheme or otherwise for the purposes of the Act in its application to this Scheme. Such contribution shall be deducted from the price paid by a curer or registered dealer for pigs purchased by him, and shall be paid by the curer or registered dealer to the Board in such manner and at such times as the Board may determine;

Provided that this provision shall be without prejudice to any other method of recovering such contribution which is authorised by the Act."

2. This Order may be cited as "The Pigs Marketing Scheme (Northern Ireland) (Amendment) Order, 1934," and shall come into force on the date hereof.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD)
AMENDMENT REGULATIONS
(NORTHERN IRELAND), 1933.

The Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland hereby gives notice, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Regulations, that the Ministry hereby recognises for the purposes of items (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Amendment Regulations, i.e. :—

(a) A severed part of the carcase of an animal (including the head or any part thereof, and the whole carcase without the head, but not including any part of the carcase of a pig which has been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared), from which no submaxillary, pre-scapular, pre-crural, superficial inguinal, supramammary, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

(c) All edible parts of an animal other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase, (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings, and (iii) meat which has before importation been made ready for human consumption in the form of a sausage or other prepared or manufactured article of food,

each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule to the Notice published by the Ministry of Health in the "London Gazette" of 29th December, 1933, as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat, or to the package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.

The Official Certificates hereby recognised are those of the following countries :—

- I. The Republic of Chili; and
- II. The Colony of Southern Rhodesia.

The label hereby recognised as an Official Certificate for meat imported from Southern Rhodesia is in substitution for the label of

which particulars were given in the Notice published in the "Belfast Gazette" of 8th September, 1933.
