**MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS FOR

EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875.**

WHEREAS Sergeant Robert Millar Fulton (No. 1432) of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, was on the 13th January, 1932, appointed to be an Inspector for Northern Ireland under the Explosives Act, 1875:

And Whereas the said Sergeant Robert Millar Fulton has received an appointment in which he is no longer available for the duties of Inspector:

Now I, The Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, being the Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, in virtue of the power conferred on me by Section 53 of the said Act, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby order that the said Sergeant Robert Millar Fulton shall from this date cease to exercise the powers and perform the duties of an Inspector under the said Act.
