The Magherafelt Area Plan 2015 is a development plan being prepared under the provisions of Part III of The Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1991 by the Planning Service, an Agency within the Department of the Environment. The Plan relates to the administrative area of Magherafelt District Council and its purpose is to inform the general public, statutory authorities, developers and other interested bodies of the policy framework and land use proposals that will be used to guide development decisions within the area.

Following the consideration of representations made in accordance with Article 5(3) of that Order the Department has published the Draft Magherafelt Plan 2015, consisting of a written statement and accompanying maps.

Any such inquiry will be advertised in due course.

Double Taxation Convention: Canada

1. The third Protocol to the Double Taxation Convention between the United Kingdom and Canada, which was signed in London on 7th May 2003, entered into force on 4th May 2004. The text has been published as the Schedule to the Double Taxation Relief (Taxes on Income) (Canada) Order 2003 (Statutory Instrument 2003 No. 2619) copies of which can be obtained from The Stationery Office. 2. The draft Order was approved by Parliament on 3rd July 2003 and details of the debate can be found in the House of Commons Official Report, Ninth Standing Committee on Delegated Legislation of the same date. The provisions of the Convention will take effect:

- (i) in the United Kingdom:
 - in respect of corporation tax, for any financial year beginning on or after 1st April 2005;
 - in respect of income tax and capital gains tax, for any year of assessment beginning on or after 6th April 2005;
- (ii) in Canada:
 - in respect of tax withheld at source, on amounts paid or credited to non-residents on or after 1st January 2005;
 - in respect of other Canadian tax, for taxation years beginning on or after 1st January 2005. (2301/2)

THE NON-IACS FARM SUPPORT (REVIEW OF DECISIONS) REGULATIONS (NORTHERN IRELAND) 2004 (SR 2004 NO. 151)
