## CHARITIES ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

## REFERENCE TO STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2, sub-section (4) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that, in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported hair combs and blanks therefor to bear an indication of origin, they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect thereof.
