The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule entitled The Goods Vehicles (Testing) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 495).

These Regulations, which come into operation on 16th January 2007, amend Schedule 2 (classes of vehicles to which these Regulations do not apply) to the Goods Vehicles (Testing) Regulations Northern Ireland 2003 (S.R. 2003 No. 304) to provide that a licence shall not be granted under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 unless information held in any form by the Department of the Environment indicates that there is an effective goods vehicle test certificate or certificate of temporary exemption in existence in respect of the vehicle.

These Regulations also substitute the reference to vehicles with an inside width of less than 810 millimetres with a reference to vehicles with an inside track width of not more than 1100 millimetres.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule entitled The Motor Vehicle (Testing) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 494).

These Regulations, which come into operation on 16th January 2007, amend regulation 6 (exemptions) of the Motor Vehicle Testing Regulations Northern Ireland 2003 (S.R. 2003 No. 303) so as to substitute the reference to vehicles with an inside width of less than 810 millimetres with a reference to vehicles with an inside track width of not more than 1100 millimetres.

These Regulations also provide that a licence shall not be granted under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 unless information held in any form by the Department of the Environment indicates that there is a current test certificate or certificate of temporary exemption in existence in respect of the vehicle.

These Regulations revoke the Motor Vehicle Testing (Amendment) Regulations 2003 (S.R. 2003 No. 518).

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (Waste Management Licensing) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006

The Statutory Rule will transpose the permitting requirements of Article 6 and Annexes II and III of Directive 2002/96/EC of the European Parliament and the Council on waste electrical and electronic equipment. Establishments carrying out treatment operations will have to hold a waste management licence or exemption therefrom to do so. The Regulations come into operation on 5th January 2007.

1. The Authority proposes to modify schedule 3 of the Firmus Energy Distribution Ltd Licence for the conveyance of gas in Northern Ireland in order to extend the period of conveyance exclusivity specified therein.

Effect

The effect is that the period for which the licensee will have conveyance exclusivity (as defined within the licence) will be extended from 10 to 20 years.

Reason

The reason for this change is to allow sufficient time for the efficient & co-ordinated development of the distribution networks in the towns along the North West and South North pipelines.

1. The Authority proposes to change Condition 2.4.2 (a) of the Firmus Energy Distribution Ltd Licence for the conveyance of gas in Northern Ireland in order to extend the deadline by which firmus energy must have a Network Code in place.

Effect

The effect is that the licensee will not have to have a Network Code in place until the earlier of:

- (i) 12 months after the Authority issues a direction requiring the Licensee to do so;
- (ii) 12 months before the Supply Licensee is scheduled (in accordance with its licence) to cease to have the exclusive right to supply a premises it was previously entitled to supply exclusively; and

time in which to develop its physical systems and processes which will form the basis of the network code; necessary for supply competition. Notice is hereby given that the Lord Chancellor in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Article 364 of the Insolvency (Northern Ireland) Order 1989 and Article 24(1) of the Company Directors Disqualification (Northern Ireland) Order 2002 has, with the concurrence of the Lord Chief Justice and the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Investment, made the following Order.

The Insolvent Partnerships (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2006 This order amends the Insolvent Partnerships Order (Northern Ireland) 1995 (S.R.1995 No. 225) ("the 1995 Order") by making the following amendments:

1. Article 4 substitutes Article 6 of the 1995 Order to take account of the amendment to Part III of the Insolvency (Northern Ireland) Order 1989 (S.I. 1989/2405 (N.I. 19)) ("the 1989 Order") by Article 3 of the Insolvency (Northern Ireland) Order 2005 (S.I. 2005/1455 (N.I. 10)) ("the 2005 Order"). Article 3 of the 2005 Order substituted Part III of the Insolvency (Northern Ireland) Order 1989 (S.I. 1989/2405 (N.I. 19)). The substituted Part III consists only of Article 21 which gives effect to Schedule B1 to the Order, which was set out in Schedule 1 to the 2005 Order. Schedule B1 makes provision for companies to go into administration by court order on an administration application or upon the appointment of an administrator by the company, its directors or the holder of a qualifying floating charge.
2. Article 7 of this Order gives effect to Schedule 1 to this Order which substitutes Schedule 2 of the 1995 Order (modified provisions of the Order applying for purposes of Article 6). The substituted Schedule 2 contains modifications to Schedule B1 to the 1989 Order.
3. Article 5 amends Article 10 of the 1995 Order to remove a reference to summary administration consequent upon the abolition of that procedure by the 2005 Order.
4. Article 6 amends Schedule 1 to the 1995 Order consequent upon the changes to administration in the 2005 Order. Article 6(4) amends the provisions of modified Schedule A1 to take account of changes to the definition of small to medium enterprises in the Companies (1986 Order) (Accounts of Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises and Audit Exemption) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2004 (S.R. 2004 No. 190).
5. Article 8 amends Schedule 3 to the 1995 Order consequent upon amendments made in the 2005 Order.
6. Article 9 amends Schedule 4 to the 1995 Order to provide for the modified application of Articles 256A and 286A of the 1989 Order which were inserted by the 2005 Order regarding treatment of the matrimonial home in bankruptcy.
7. Articles 10 and 11 amend the application of Article 185 of the Insolvency (Northern Ireland) Order 1989 to ensure that the requirement to set aside a "prescribed part" (Article 150A of the Insolvency (Northern Ireland) Order 1989) does not apply to the winding up of an insolvent partnership.
8. Article 12 amends Schedule 7 to the 1995 Order to remove references to summary administration consequent upon the abolition of that procedure by the 2005 Order, and to make provision for the application of Articles 256A and 286A of the 1989 Order as inserted by the 2005 Order regarding treatment of the matrimonial home in bankruptcy.
9. Article 13 amends Schedule 8 to the 1995 Order (modification of Company Directors Disqualification (Northern Ireland) Order 2002) consequent upon amendments made by the 2005 Order.
10. Article 14 and Schedule 2 provide for modified Forms for the administration of Insolvent Partnerships.
