

Section 141 of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979

If you claim that the goods were not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of publication of this notice of seizure, give notice of your claim in writing to the Commissioners at an office of Revenue and Customs. Your notice must also specify your name and address, the goods claimed as not liable to forfeiture.

If you live outside the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man you must also give the name and address of a solicitor within the United Kingdom who is authorised to accept service of the process on your behalf.

If you do not give notice of claim within the said period of one month or, if any requirement of the above mentioned paragraph 4 is not complied with, the goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeit.

If you do give notice of claim in the proper form, the Commissioners will take legal proceedings for the condemnation of the said goods.

Roads (NI) Order

DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule entitled The Goods Vehicles (Testing) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 495).

These Regulations, which come into operation on 16th January 2007, amend Schedule 2 (classes of vehicles to which these Regulations do not apply) to the Goods Vehicles (Testing) Regulations Northern Ireland 2003 (S.R. 2003 No. 304) to provide that a licence shall not be granted under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 unless information held in any form by the Department of the Environment indicates that there is an effective goods vehicle test certificate or certificate of temporary exemption in existence in respect of the vehicle.

These Regulations also substitute the reference to vehicles with an inside width of less than 810 millimetres with a reference to vehicles with an inside track width of not more than 1100 millimetres.

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule entitled The Motor Vehicle (Testing) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 494).

These Regulations, which come into operation on 16th January 2007, amend regulation 6 (exemptions) of the Motor Vehicle Testing Regulations Northern Ireland 2003 (S.R. 2003 No. 303) so as to substitute the reference to vehicles with an inside width of less than 810 millimetres with a reference to vehicles with an inside track width of not more than 1100 millimetres.

These Regulations also provide that a licence shall not be granted under the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 unless information held in any form by the Department of the Environment indicates that there is a current test certificate or certificate of temporary exemption in existence in respect of the vehicle.

These Regulations revoke the Motor Vehicle Testing (Amendment) Regulations 2003 (S.R. 2003 No. 518).

Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (Waste Management Licensing) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006

The Department of the Environment has made a Statutory Rule entitled Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (Waste Management Licensing) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 519). The Rule is made under powers conferred by section 2(2) of the European Communities Act 1972 and Articles 2(8), 4(3) and 6(6) of the Waste and Contaminated Land (Northern Ireland) Order 1997. The Statutory Rule will transpose the permitting requirements of Article 6 and Annexes II and III of Directive 2002/96/EC of the European Parliament and the Council on waste electrical and electronic equipment. Establishments carrying out treatment operations will have to hold a waste management licence or exemption therefrom to do so. The Regulations come into operation on 5th January 2007.
