These Regulations prescribe the charge in respect of the immobilisation and release of vehicles in contravention of traffic offences subject to civil enforcement.

The Traffic Management (2005 Order) (Commencement) Order (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 347 (C. 18)) which was made on 23rd August 2006 and came into operation on 30th October 2006.

The On-Street Parking (Amendment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 362) which was made on 8th September 2006 and came into operation on 30th October 2006.

The effect of the amendment is to delete the provisions relating to the removal of a vehicle (except in an emergency) or the altering of its position and to make minor changes to the On-Street Parking Order as a consequence of the introduction of civil enforcement.

The Off-Street Parking (Amendment No. 2) Order (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 363) which was made on 8th September 2006 and came into operation on 30th October 2006. The effect of the amendment is to disapply Excess and Alternative Charges and to delete the provisions relating to the removal and safe custody of vehicles.

The Penalty Charges (Exemption from Criminal Proceedings) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 376) which was made on 15th September 2006 and came into operation on 30th October 2006. These Regulations prescribe the road traffic offences which are subject to civil enforcement and are exempt from criminal proceedings for the purposes of Article 4(7) of the Traffic Management (Northern Ireland) Order 2005.

The Penalty Charges (Exemption from Criminal Proceedings) (Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 432) which was made on 27th October 2006 and came into operation on 30th October 2006. These Regulations amend The Penalty Charges (Exemption from Criminal Proceedings) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 by deleting Article 2(1)(d) and removing certain offences from Article 2(2).

The Immobilisation and Removal of Vehicles (Prescribed Conditions) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 (S.R. 2006 No. 479) which was made on 24th November 2006 and came into operation on 1st January 2007. These Regulations prescribe the condition which must be satisfied before the Department may fix an immobilisation device to a vehicle or remove a stationary vehicle to another place. THE FIREFIGHTERS' COMPENSATION SCHEME ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND) 2007

The Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety has made The Firefighters' Compensation Scheme Order (Northern Ireland) 2007.

This Order provides for a new compensation scheme for firefighters in Northern Ireland. The new scheme is set out in Schedule 1 to the Order and, subject to provisions relating to rule 3 of Part 2, which has effect from 1st April 2000, has effect from 1st April 2006. The power to give

retrospective effect to provisions is conferred by Article 10(4) of the Fire Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1984, as continued by Article 60 of the Fire and Rescue Services (Northern Ireland) Order 2006.

The new scheme consists primarily of provisions relating to ill-health and injury awards in respect of firefighters, their spouses, civil partners, children and other dependants, that are similar to those contained in, but to be removed from, the Pension Scheme.

The new scheme also includes (in rule 3 of Part 2) provisions based on those that previously formed part of the conditions of service applicable to firefighters. The provisions relate to the payment of compensation in respect of firefighters who die or sustain seriously disabling injuries while on duty.

The broad effect of rule 3 of Part 2 is that, where the firefighter dies while on duty, compensation of a lump sum, equivalent to five years' pensionable pay after four years' service, at the rate applying at the date of the incident, is payable to his or her dependants. If there are no dependants, a flat-rate payment of £950 is made to the deceased's estate. Those amounts are subject to abatement depending on the amount of any damages or compensation received by the firefighter or his or her dependants, and any gratuities paid.

Article 3 of the Order enables a person whose position under the new scheme would be less favourable than that under the Pension Scheme to elect to retain benefits under that Scheme. Notice of election has to be given to the Board before 16th April 2007. (2301/79)

THE FIREFIGHTERS' PENSION SCHEME ORDER (NORTHERN IRELAND) 2007

The Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety has made The Firefighters' Pension Scheme Order (Northern Ireland) 2007. It revokes and replaces the Firemen's Pension Scheme Order (Northern Ireland) 2006, effecting necessary changes to the Scheme to reflect changes in taxation legislation.

The principal changes, apart from those that consist in the omission of spent or obsolete provisions, are:

- to make provision for the making of contributions and counting as pensionable service periods during when a member is on maternity, paternity or adoption leave (see articles 7, 12, 16, 45, 46, 47, 56, 58, Schedule 1 and Part III of Schedule 2);
- to anticipate the introduction of a new pension scheme, provision has been made for the Pension Scheme to cease to have effect on the day on which the new scheme is brought into operation (see article 2 and 57) as respects—

persons who take up employment with the Board as regular firefighters on or after 6th April 2006;

persons who, having made an election under article 59 of the Pension Scheme not to pay pension contributions, cancel that election on or after 6th April 2006; and

the spouses, civil partners and dependants of those two classes of person;

it is envisaged that the new scheme will require those classes of person to become members of it. Article 58 provides for a lower rate of contribution for those classes of person than for a firefighter whose employment with the Board began before 6th April 2006;

- the majority of the other amendments made by the Order have the effect of removing from the Pension Scheme provisions relating to non-contributory compensation for death and injury, or are consequential on the removal of those provisions. The provisions removed from the Pension Scheme are re-enacted in the Firefighters' Compensation Scheme, which is set out in the Schedule to the Firefighters' Compensation Scheme Order (Northern Ireland) 2007.
- the provisions which relate to the payment and calculation of pensions awarded to regular firefighters whose employment ceases by way of ill-health have been replaced. Firefighters who are found by a qualified medical practitioner to be capable of undertaking employment outside of the fire and rescue service for 30 hours a week on average over a 12-month period (whether or not they actually take up any employment) will be entitled to a lower tier ill-health pension. Those who are found to be incapable of undertaking such employment will be entitled to both a lower tier ill-health pension and a higher tier ill-health pension. There is no change in the method of calculating the newly styled "higher tier" ill-health pension (paragraph 4 of Part III of Schedule 2), it will not be possible,

however, to commute any portion of the higher-tier award. Nor is there any change in the method of calculating the newly styled "lower tier" ill-health pension for those regular firefighters who have less than 5 years' pensionable service (paragraph 3 of that Part). The method of calculating other "lower tier" ill-health pensions (paragraph 2 of that Part) has the effect that a pensioner who has 5 or more years' pensionable service will be entitled to immediate payment of a deferred pension under article 16 of the Pension Scheme (the calculation is set out in Part V of Schedule 2).

- the correction of an anomaly in the rules which allowed an individual who was found unfit for fire-fighting, but able to carry out other duties, to resign with a deferred pension prior to re-deployment, and immediately request early payment of that pension on the ground that he or she was permanently unfit for fire-fighting (see article 16(4)(b));
- to introduce a new Part (Part P) which requires the Board to establish and maintain a Firefighters' Pension Fund ("the Fund") for the purposes of the Pension Scheme and in connection with the rights and liabilities under earlier versions of the Scheme. Why have the charges changed? After five years of price stability we are keen to introduce a new structure which will simplify administration for customers and continue to improve the quality of data published. To this end the Belfast Gazette will offer a two tier pricing structure with the lower tier available to those able to provide content in a predefined structured format. At present this applies to webforms, for username and login details please email belfast.gazette@tso.co.uk.

I place public notices will I be impacted? Customers placing public notices, other than Notice of Orders/Statutory Rules should email them in for a quotation as previously. The Authorised Scale of Charges for notices published from 1st March will continue to compare extremely favourably with the cost of newspaper advertising.

I regularly place corporate insolvency related notices. Will my costs increase? The costs of some notices will increase and some will decrease. Although it will vary depending upon the mix of notices published customers who submit in predefined structured format will probably find their costs broadly the similar to present.

Example, the total cost of submitting an insolvency notice or a Notice of Orders/Statutory Rules by webform, including Vat and a voucher copy will be **£53.63 inclusive**. For email, fax or postal submission the cost will be **£71.25 inclusive**.
