 The Civil Aviation Authority (“CAA”), in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 73, 74 and 75 of the Transport Act 2000(a), hereby makes the following Specification:

Citation and commencement

1. This Specification may be cited as the Civil Aviation Authority (Navigation Services Charges) Specification 2007 and shall take effect on 1st April 2007.

Revocation

2. The Civil Aviation Authority (Navigation Services Charges) Specification 2006, which took effect on 1st April 2006, is hereby revoked.

Interpretation

3.—(1) In this Specification –

“NERL” means NATS (En Route) plc, a company incorporated in England and Wales with number 4129273 whose registered office is at 5th Floor South, Brettenham House, Lancaster Place, London WC2E 7EN;

“NSL” means NATS (Services) Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales with number 4129270 whose registered office is at 5th Floor South, Brettenham House, Lancaster Place, London WC2E 7EN;

“the specified amount” means, in relation to a landing or take-off, the additional cost incurred by NSL in providing chargeable air services by reason of the landing or take-off, as the case may be, being made outside hours;

“the standard charge” means, for each complete metric tonne of the maximum total weight authorised of the aircraft in respect of which the charge is made, and for each fraction of a metric tonne, a charge for services provided in connection with the use of any one of the aerodromes specified in column 1 of the following Table in respect of an aircraft engaged on any flight, of the amount specified in relation to that aerodrome in column 4 of the said Table;

“United Kingdom Air Pilot” means the document so entitled in force at the date of making this Specification and published under the authority of the CAA;

“within hours” means within the notified hours of watch of the air traffic control unit at the aerodrome, and “outside hours” shall be construed accordingly.

(2) Unless otherwise defined in this Specification and unless the context otherwise requires, expressions used in this Specification shall have the same respective meanings as in the Transport Act 2000 and the Air Navigation Order 2005(b).

Charges for services at aerodromes

4.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Specification, the operator of every aircraft for which chargeable air services are provided by NSL in respect of the charge specified in column 2 of the Table in paragraph 3(1) of this Specification and for which chargeable air services are provided by NERL in respect of the charge specified in column 3 in connection with the use of an aerodrome referred to in column 1 (whether or not the services are actually used or could be used with the equipment installed in the aircraft) shall pay to NSL for the services provided by NSL or NERL on the occasion specified in column 1 of the following Table the charges specified in relation to those occasions in column 2. Any amounts payable in respect of the Terminal Approach Service Charge to NERL shall be paid to NSL on behalf of NERL.

(2) Where on the occasion of any landing or take-off (as the case may be) other than one to which sub-paragraph (4) of this paragraph applies in connection with a flight which is not for the purpose of public transport the shortest distance in the case of a landing between the aerodrome of departure and the aerodrome of landing and in the case of a take-off between the aerodrome of departure and the aerodrome of intended landing does not exceed 185 kilometres measured along the great circle, for the references to “the standard charge” in the Table in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph there shall be substituted references to “50% of the standard charge”.

(3) Subject to sub-paragraph (6) below, where on the occasion of any landing or take-off (as the case may be) at Aberdeen (Dyce), Edinburgh or Glasgow aerodrome by an aircraft on a scheduled journey the shortest distance in the case of a landing between the aerodrome of departure and the aerodrome of landing and in the case of a take-off between the aerodrome of departure and the aerodrome of intended landing does not exceed 185 kilometres measured along the great circle, for the references to “the standard charge” in the Table in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph there shall be substituted references to “50% of the standard charge”.

(4) Where on the occasion of any landing or take-off (as the case may be) in connection with a flight made exclusively for the purpose of instruction or testing of flight crew, for the references to “the standard charge” in the Table in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph there shall be substituted references to “50% of the standard charge” in the case of any aerodrome referred to in the Table in paragraph 3(1) of this Specification.

(5) The minimum charge payable under this paragraph shall be £10.00.

(6) Sub-paragraph (3) above shall not apply to any flight to which paragraph 7 applies.

Charges for approach services provided from an aerodrome to aircraft which do not land at that aerodrome

5.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Specification, the operator of every aircraft engaged on a flight which is not for the purpose of public transport for which chargeable air services are provided by NSL in connection with an approach to an aerodrome referred to in the Table in paragraph 3(1) of this Specification, not being the aerodrome of intended landing of the aircraft (whether or not the services are actually used or could be used with the equipment installed in the aircraft), shall pay to NSL for those services for each approach to any aerodrome referred to in the said Table 25% of the standard charge.

(2) The minimum charge payable under this paragraph shall be £10.00.

Charges for services provided in the Shanwick Oceanic Control Area

6. Subject to the provisions of this Specification, the operator of every aircraft (whether or not registered in the United Kingdom) which flies within the Shanwick Oceanic Control Area, as described in the United Kingdom Air Pilot on the date this Specification takes effect, and in respect of which a flight plan is communicated to the appropriate air traffic control unit in relation to its flight in that Area shall pay to NERL, for the chargeable air services made available by it in relation to that flight, a charge of £55.68.

Charges for services provided for North Sea helicopters

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Specification, the operator of every helicopter (whether or not registered in the United Kingdom) which flies within the area specified in sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph while on a flight from any place in the United Kingdom to a vessel or an off-shore installation within the said area shall pay to NERL, for the chargeable air services made available by it in relation to that flight, a charge of £207.00.

(2) The area referred to in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph is the area bounded by straight lines joining successively the following points -

6300N 00500W; 632833N 000000EW; thence south along the UK Median Line to 5500N 00302E; 5500N 00100W; 5600N 00230W; 5740N 00230W; 5740N 00400W; 5830N 00400W; 5830N 00500W; 6300N 00500W.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this Specification, the operator of every helicopter (whether or not registered in the United Kingdom) which flies within the area specified in sub-paragraph (4) of this paragraph while on a flight from any place in the United Kingdom to a vessel or an off-shore installation within the said area shall pay to NERL for the chargeable air services made available by it in relation to that flight, a charge of £78.00.

(4) The area referred to in sub-paragraph (3) of this paragraph is the area bounded by straight lines joining successively the following points -

5500N 00100W; 5500N 00300E; 5423N 00245E; 5256N 00309E; 5230N 00247E; 5226N 00137E; 5238N 00140E; 5251N 00124E; 5319N 00010E; 5500N 00100W.

Value Added Tax charge

8. For the purpose of reimbursing NERL and NSL in respect of value added tax payable on the provision of chargeable air services for which a charge is payable pursuant to this Specification there shall be charged an additional charge equal to the amount of such tax and the incidence of the first mentioned charge shall determine the incidence of the additional charge.

Services provided outside hours where the intention to land or take-off is not carried out

9.—(1) Subject to sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph, whenever, by reason of its having received from the operator or commander of an aircraft notice of intention to make use outside hours of an aerodrome referred to in the Table in paragraph 3(1) of this Specification for landing or take-off or as an alternate aerodrome, NSL provides chargeable air services outside hours but the aircraft does not land or take-off on the occasion specified in the notice, the operator of the aircraft shall pay, in respect of each such aerodrome -

(a) in the case of an intended landing or intended use of the aerodrome as an alternate aerodrome, an amount equal to the surcharge payable under paragraph (b) of the Table in paragraph 3(1) of this Specification on the landing of the aircraft outside hours;

(b) in the case of an intended take-off, an amount equal to the charge, if any, which would have been payable under paragraph (c) of the Table in paragraph 3(1) of this Specification if the aircraft had actually taken off outside hours at the intended time.

(2) A charge shall not be payable under this paragraph if the notice of intention is cancelled not less than 30 minutes before the end of the last period of watch within hours before the time specified in the notice for

landing or for the intended use of the aerodrome as an alternate aerodrome or for take-off, as the case may be.

Circumstances in which charges are payable by the owner

10. If either NERL or NSL as appropriate is unable, after taking reasonable steps, to ascertain who is the operator, it may give notice to the owner of the aircraft that it will treat him as the operator for the purposes of this Specification until he establishes to the reasonable satisfaction of NERL and NSL as appropriate that some other person is the operator; and from the time when the notice is given NERL and NSL as appropriate shall be entitled, for so long as the owner is unable to establish as aforesaid that some other person is the operator, to treat the owner as if he were the operator, and for that purpose the provisions of this Specification (other than this paragraph) shall apply to the owner as if he were the operator.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Specification)

1. This Specification revokes and replaces the Civil Aviation Authority (Navigation Services Charges) Specification 2006.

2. The Specification sets out the charges payable to NATS (Services) Limited ("NSL"), for chargeable air services provided in connection with the use of London Heathrow, London Gatwick, London Stansted, Aberdeen (Dyce), Edinburgh and Glasgow Aerodromes (paragraphs 3, 4 and 5). The charges payable to NSL have been changed as follows -

In respect of the three London Airports, the standard charge for the first 100 metric tonnes maximum total weight authorised of an aircraft, or part thereof, is increased from £1.46 per metric tonne to £1.54. For each additional metric tonne, or part thereof, in excess of 100 metric tonnes, the standard charge is increased from £0.58 per metric tonne to £0.62.

From 21 April 2007 a control tower building supplement is introduced for Heathrow Airport. The supplementary charge is £0.16 for the first 100 metric tonnes maximum total weight authorised of an aircraft, or part thereof and £0.07 for each additional metric tonne, or part thereof, in excess of 100 metric tonnes.

The standard charge at Aberdeen (Dyce) for the first 20 metric tonnes maximum total weight authorised of an aircraft, or part thereof is increased from £5.90 per metric tonne to £6.29. For each additional metric tonne, or part thereof in excess of 20 metric tonnes the standard charge is increased from £3.65 per metric tonne to £3.89. The standard charge for Edinburgh increases from £2.03 per metric tonne to £2.25. The supplementary charge in respect of the new control tower building is increased from £0.35 per metric tonne to £0.36. The total charge is increased from £2.38 per metric tonne to £2.61.

The standard charge for Glasgow is increased from £2.03 per metric tonne to £2.33.

3. The charge payable to NATS (En Route) plc ("NERL"), by the operator of an aircraft which flies within the Shanwick Oceanic Control Area and in respect of which a flight plan is communicated to the appropriate air traffic control unit is reduced from £56.01 to £55.68 (paragraph 6).

4. The charge payable to NERL, by the operator of a helicopter which flies from any place in the United Kingdom to a vessel or an off-shore installation within the area of the Northern North Sea described in paragraph 7(2) remains at £207 (paragraph 7(1)).

5. The charge payable to NERL, by the operator of a helicopter which flies from any place in the United Kingdom to a vessel or an off-shore installation within the area of the Southern North Sea described in paragraph 7(4) is reduced from £117 to £78 (paragraph 7(3)).

This Order makes provision for a new pension scheme for and in respect of firefighters employed by the Northern Ireland Fire and Rescue Service ("the new Scheme"). The new Scheme has effect from 6th April 2006 and replaces the Firefighters' Pension Scheme set out in the Annex to the Firefighters' Pension Scheme Order 2007 ("the 2007 Scheme"). Power to give the Scheme retrospective effect is conferred by Article 10(4) of the Fire Services (Northern Ireland) Order 1984, as continued by the Fire and Rescue Services (Northern Ireland) Order 2006.

Part 1 of the new Scheme contains general introductory provisions.

The new Scheme is available to all firefighters employed by the Northern Ireland Fire and Rescue Service, whether whole-time or part-time and whether regular, retained or volunteer, who satisfy one of the eligibility conditions set out in Part 2 of the Scheme. Part 2 also deals with membership of the Scheme.

Part 3 makes provision for the payment of pensions to firefighter members. It introduces Schedule 1, which provides for the calculation of ill-health pensions.

Part 4 deals, in Chapter 1, with pensions for surviving spouses, civil partners and nominated partners and, in Chapter 2, with pensions for children.

Part 5 provides for the payment of death grants and post-retirement death grants.

Part 6 deals with pension-sharing on divorce.

Part 7 contains provisions relevant to firefighters who serve in the armed forces.

Part 8, to which Schedule 2 to the Scheme is relevant, provides for the determination of questions and appeals arising under the Scheme.

Part 9 deals with the review, withdrawal and forfeiture of awards.

Part 10 contains provisions about qualifying service and pensionable service.

Part 11 deals with pensionable pay, pension contributions and the purchase of additional service.

Part 12 provides for transfers into and out of the Scheme.

Part 13 deals with the accounting aspects of the Scheme, including the operation of the Firefighters' Pension Fund for that purpose.

Part 14 provides for the payment of awards.

Part 15 contains miscellaneous provisions, including provisions about annual benefit statements.

The new Scheme differs from the 2007 Scheme in the following major respects:

- (a) it is open to retained and volunteer firefighters as well as regular firefighters;
- (b) pensions can be paid to a nominated partner as well as a spouse or civil partner;
- (c) the normal retirement age will be 60; under the 2007 Scheme it is 55 (with some exceptions);
- (d) the age at which deferred pensions will normally be paid will be 65; under the 2007 Scheme it is 60;
- (e) firefighter members may request early payment of pension from age 55, subject to actuarial reduction;
- (f) the Board may for economical, effective and efficient management reasons pay pensions from age 55 without actuarial reduction; under the 2007 Scheme, payment could be made in

similar circumstances from age 50 provided that the firefighter had at least 25 years' pensionable service;

- (g) pension will accrue at 1/60th per year. A firefighter member will be able to accrue more than 40 years' pensionable service;
- (h) a firefighter member will be able to commute up to a quarter of his pension for a lump sum [and there will be a single commutation factor regardless of age or sex with each £1 of pension commuted providing a lump sum of £12];
- (i) enhancements for the higher tier ill-health retirement pension will be based on a formula where accrued pensionable service is increased by 2% and then multiplied by the amount of prospective service to the normal retirement age. This will ensure that enhancements are more evenly graduated than under the 2007 Scheme;
- (j) where a firefighter member is subject to a reduction in pay because of a change in role he will qualify for a split pension. At the point of reduction the first pension will be closed and therefore based on the higher pay rate and a new pension started. When the member retires both pensions will be payable;
- (k) the death grant when a firefighter member dies in service will be three times pensionable pay at the date of death; under the 2007 Scheme it is two times pensionable pay;
- (l) any pension paid to an adult survivor who is 12 or more years younger than the firefighter member will be reduced by 2.5% for every year or part year above the 12 years, up to maximum of 50%; there is no such restriction under the 2007 Scheme;
- (m) the member's contribution rate will be 8.5%; under the 2007 Scheme, for members who joined before 6th April 2006, the rate was 11%.

Service transferred from the 2007 Scheme will be transferred at a special rate during the first three months after the new Scheme comes into force. (2301/33)

8 Where the Publisher is responsible for any error which, in the Publisher's reasonable opinion, causes a substantive change to the meaning of a Notice or would affect the legal efficacy of a Notice, upon notification of such error by the Advertiser, the Publisher shall publish the corrected Notice at no charge and at the next suitable opportunity and this shall be the limit of the Publishers liability or responsibility in these circumstances.

9 In the event that the Publisher believes an Advertiser is deliberately submitting Notices in bad faith and in breach of clause 10 below, or has dealings with Advertisers who are in persistent breach of these Terms and Conditions, the Publisher may require further verification of information be provided by such Advertisers and may at its discretion delay publication of those Notices as far as it is able to, until it is satisfied that the Notice it has received is based on authentic information.

10 The location of the Notice in the Belfast Gazette shall be at the discretion of the Publisher. For the avoidance of doubt, the Notice shall be published in the house style of the Belfast Gazette.

11 The Advertiser warrants:

11.1 that it has the right, power and authority to submit the Notice;

11.2 the Notice is not false, inaccurate, misleading nor does it contain fraudulent information;

11.3 the Notice is submitted in good faith, does not contravene any Act of Parliament nor is it in any way illegal or defamatory or an infringement of any other party's rights or an infringement of the British Code of Advertising Practice.

12 To the extent permissible by law the Publisher excludes all implied warranties, conditions or other terms, whether implied by statute or otherwise.

13 The Advertiser agrees to indemnify and hold the Publisher and/or (as applicable) the Publisher's affiliates, officers, directors, agents and employees harmless from all losses incurred (including legal costs), in respect of any claim or demand, including threatened claims or demands, made by any third party which constitute, or would if proved constitute, a breach or threatened breach by the Advertiser of these Terms and Conditions or any breach by the Advertiser of any law or an infringement of the rights of a third party. The Publisher shall consult with the Advertiser as to the way in which such claims are handled but the Publisher retain the final decision on all aspects of the claim, including choice of instructing solicitors, steps taken in litigation and decisions to settle the case. The Advertiser shall provide, at its own expense, such co-operation and assistance as the Publisher may reasonably request, including the provision of witnesses, access to premises and delivery up of documents.

14 The Advertiser shall promptly notify the Publisher in writing of any actual, threatened or suspected claim made by a third party or parties against the Advertiser and/or the Publisher in relation to a Notice. The Publisher reserves the right, following a claim or threatened claim, to immediately remove the Notice which is the subject of the complaint from the website at www.gazettes-online.co.uk and all other websites controlled by the Publisher containing the Notice. The Publisher may require the Advertiser to amend the Notice at its own cost before it agrees to re-publish the Notice if it is capable of rectification to avoid the claim or threatened claim. Any reinstatement of the Notice shall be at the sole discretion of the Publisher.

15 The Advertiser acknowledges that the Publisher may re-use Notices and/or allow third parties to re-use Notices accepted for publication in the Belfast Gazette, and hereby assigns to the Publisher all rights, including but not limited to, copyright in all Notices, and warrants that any such activity by the Publisher and/or third parties does not and will not infringe any legal right of the Advertiser or any third party.

16 The Advertiser accepts that the purpose of the Belfast Gazette is to disseminate information of interest to the public as widely as possible and that the information contained in the Notices published in the Belfast Gazette may be used by third parties after publication for any purpose. In such instance, the Publisher accepts no liability whatsoever.

17 The Advertiser accepts that the Charges may be amended from time to time and will be payable at the rate in force at the time of invoicing unless otherwise agreed by the Publisher. The Charges must be paid by the Advertiser in advance of publication unless other requirements of the Publisher (as determined from time to time) are notified to the Advertiser.

18 If the Advertiser wishes to make a Complaint then please refer to the Gazette office.

19 A person who is not a party to these Terms and Conditions has no right under the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999 to enforce any term of these Terms and Conditions but this does not affect any right or remedy of a third party specified in these Terms and Conditions or which exists or is available apart from that Act.

20 These Terms and Conditions and all other express terms of the contract shall be governed and construed in accordance with the Laws of England and the parties hereby submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English courts.

Why have the charges changed? After five years of price stability we are keen to introduce a new structure which will simplify administration for customers and continue to improve the quality of data published. To this end the Belfast Gazette will offer a two tier pricing structure with the lower tier available to those able to provide content in a predefined structured format. At present this applies to webforms, for username and login details please email belfast.gazette@tso.co.uk.

I place public notices will I be impacted? Customers placing public notices, other than Notice of Orders/Statutory Rules should email them in for a quotation as previously. The Authorised Scale of Charges for notices published from 1st March will continue to compare extremely favourably with the cost of newspaper advertising.

I regularly place corporate insolvency related notices. Will my costs increase? The costs of some notices will increase and some will decrease. Although it will vary depending upon the mix of notices published customers who submit in predefined structured format will probably find their costs broadly the similar to present.

Example, the total cost of submitting an insolvency notice or a Notice of Orders/Statutory Rules by webform, including Vat and a voucher copy will be **£53.63 inclusive**. For email, fax or postal submission the cost will be **£71.25 inclusive**.



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
