The Scottish Parliament (Letters Patent and Proclamations) Order 1999

The following Letters Patent were signed by Her Majesty The Queen on the 14 July 2008 in respect of the Public Health etc. (Scotland) Bill asp 5.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and of Our other Realms and Territories Queen Head of the Commonwealth Defender of the Faith To Our trusty and well beloved the members of the Scottish Parliament GREETING:

FORASMUCH as a Bill has been passed by the Scottish Parliament and has been submitted to Us for Our Royal Assent by the Presiding Officer of the Scottish Parliament in accordance with the Scotland Act 1998 the short Title of which Bill is set forth in the Schedule hereto but that Bill by virtue of the Scotland Act 1998 does not become an Act of the Scottish Parliament nor have effect in the Law without Our Royal Assent signified by Letters Patent under Our Scottish Seal (that is Our Seal appointed by the Treaty of Union to be kept and used in Scotland in place of the Great Seal of Scotland) signed with Our own hand and recorded in the Register of the Great Seal We have therefore caused these Our Letters Patent to be made and have signed them and by them do give Our Royal Assent to that Bill COMMANDING ALSO the Keeper of Our Scottish Seal to seal these Our Letters with that Seal.

Commencement of provisions of the Dentists Act 1984 (Amendment) Order 2005

In accordance with articles 1(5), (6) and (7) of the Dentists Act 1984 (Amendment) Order 2005(a), the Department of Health gives notice that the Secretary of State for Health has specified 31 July 2008 as the day for the coming into force of the following provisions of that Order:

(1) article 27 which relates to sections 34A (rules in respect of professional training and development requirements for dentists) and 34B (restoration of names to the dentists register: professional training and development) of the Dentists Act 1984, in so far as it is not already in force(b);

(2) article 33 in so far as it relates to the insertion of sections 36Z1 (rules in respect of professional training and development requirements for dental care professionals) and 36Z2 (restoration of names to the dental care professionals register: professional training and development) into the Dentists Act 1984, in so far as it is not already in force(b);

(3) Schedule 1(c), in so far as it relates to—

(a) the reference to paragraph 2(1)(i) in the definition of “the requisite period” in paragraph 1 of Schedule 2A;

(b) paragraph 2(1)(h) and (i) of Schedule 2A; and

(c) the reference to paragraph 2(1)(i) in paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 2A; and

(4) Schedule 3(d), in so far as it relates to—

(a) the reference to paragraph 2(1)(h) in the definition of “the requisite period” in paragraph 1 of Schedule 4A;

(b) paragraph 2(1)(g) and (h) of Schedule 4A; and

(c) the reference to paragraph 2(1)(h) in paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 4A.
