The development will also comprise associated transformers, site access tracks, gates, site control room, substation, temporary construction compound, electrical cabling, site entrance, road improvement works at the site entrance on Whitebridge Road and all other ancillary works.

The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development for Northern Ireland hereby gives Notice in pursuance of Article 12 of The Drainage (Northern Ireland) Order 1973 as amended by the Drainage (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2006 that it proposes to carry out a drainage scheme at Skea Crossroads, Arney, Co. Fermanagh.

The scheme relates to a 695 m length of watercourse that flows from its upstream limits, south east of Skea Crossroads, Arney to its confluence with the designated Sillees main watercourse.

The works will consist of the replacement of inadequate culverts and associated channel works.
