ORDER.

CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 and 1933.

Whereas Notices have been published calling a Meeting to be held in the City Hall, Armagh, on Friday, the 11th January, 1935, commencing at 8-30 p.m., purporting to be a Reception upon the release of certain prisoners from Belfast Prison.

And whereas there is reason to apprehend that such Meeting or Reception will give rise to grave disorder or conduce to a breach of the peace or will promote disaffection.

Now, therefore, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Acts, do hereby prohibit the holding of any such Meeting or any Procession or Assembly in connection therewith within the said City Hall, Armagh, or within the area of the parliamentary counties of Armagh and Down.
