When the wind speed is approximately 4 m/s the machine rotor will run up to synchronous speed. The rotor is connected to the grid via the converter and provides stator magnetisation at a level of slip that generates synchronous stator output. When the generated voltage is within specified voltage, frequency and phase angle limits the stator will be switched onto the grid via the dedicated turbine circuit-breaker. When the wind speed falls below 4m/s the turbine circuit breaker will open and the cycle will repeat.

At wind speeds above 25m/s (56mph) the turbine will also shut down. Once the wind speed drops below 25m/s for a predetermined length of time the machine will re-synchronise to the grid.
