PUBLICATION OF DRAFT DESIGN GUIDANCE FOR MAGEE CONSERVATION AREA

The Planning (Northern Ireland) Order 1991

The Department of the Environment, in pursuance of powers conferred upon it by Article 50 of the Planning (NI) Order 1991, designated the area around Magee as a Conservation Area in June 2006, as it is considered to be of special architectural or historic interest, the character of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance.

THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE (NORTHERN IRELAND) ORDER 2008 (COMMENCEMENT No. 6 AND TRANSITIONAL PROVISION) ORDER 2010

The Secretary of State for Northern Ireland has made the Criminal Justice (Northern Ireland) Order 2008 (Commencement No. 6 and Transitional Provision) Order 2010 in exercise of the powers conferred by Articles 1(4) and 100(4) of the Criminal Justice (Northern Ireland) Order 2008.

This Order brings into operation the provisions of Article 92 of the Criminal Justice (Northern Ireland) Order 2008 on 26th February 2010.

Article 92 makes provision to enable a wider range of magistrates' courts to hear the proving of the execution of arrest warrants. In appropriate circumstances an arrest warrant issued in one County Court Division could be proven in the Division of arrest or in a County Court Division which adjoins the Division of arrest.

Article 92 covers 3 main types of warrant as follows:

- Article 20 of the Magistrates Court (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 – Issue of summons to accused or warrant for arrest
- Article 25 of the Magistrates Court (Northern Ireland) Order 1981 – Convicted in absence/Fails to answer summons/Fails to appear at adjourned hearing.
- Article 6 of the Criminal Justice 2003 Order – Released on Bail and fails to appear or released on Bail and appears but leave Court prior to the case being heard. (2301/64)

FUNDING OF THE CONSUMER CREDIT JURISDICTION INCLUDING CONTRIBUTIONS IMPOSED ON APPLICANTS FOR A STANDARD CONSUMER CREDIT LICENCE OR RENEWAL OF SUCH A LICENCE

Total sum to be raised

1. The Office of Fair Trading (OFT) hereby gives general notice pursuant to section 234A(4) of the Financial Services and Markets Act 2000 (FSMA) of a determination made by the Financial Ombudsman Service Limited (FOS) with the approval of the Financial Services Authority (FSA). The Determination was made pursuant to section 234A(1) of FSMA and determines that the sum of £2,475,000 is to be raised by way of contributions for the period

ending 31 March 2011 for the purpose of funding the operation of the ombudsman scheme so far as it relates to the consumer credit jurisdiction. Such sum includes collection costs of £75,000 but excludes any value added tax.

Contributions

2. Further, for the purpose of raising the sum of £2,475,000 referred to in paragraph 1 above and subject to the exceptions referred to in paragraph 4 below, the OFT, by general notice pursuant to section 234A(5) of FSMA herein imposes requirements as described in paragraph 3 on persons who make applications for a standard consumer credit licence or for the renewal of a standard consumer credit licence ('applicant' or 'applicants').

Requirements

3. Unless applicants fall within any of the exceptions set down in paragraph 4, below, they are required to pay a contribution of £150 ('the contribution') to the OFT. The contribution must accompany the application to the OFT for a standard consumer credit licence or for the renewal of a standard consumer credit licence ('the application').

Exceptions from requirements

4. There will be no requirement to pay the contribution:
- where the application relates only to the category of business of debt adjusting and/or debt counselling and/or the provision of credit information services and neither the applicant nor an associate* makes or requires any charge, fee or commission in connection with its business
 - where the applicant is a society registered under the Friendly Societies Act 1974 pursuant to a special authority issued by the Treasury under section 7 of that Act
 - where the applicant is a credit union registered as such under the Industrial and Provident Societies Act 1965, in accordance with the Credit Unions Act 1979 or the Industrial and Provident Societies Act (Northern Ireland) 1969
 - where, as a person directly authorised by the FSA, the applicant is subject to the compulsory jurisdiction of the ombudsman scheme as administered by the FOS, defined in section 226 of FSMA.

*"associate" has the meaning given by s.184 of the Consumer Credit Act 1974

Refunds of the contribution paid

5. A refund (in full or in part) of the contribution paid will be made in any of the following circumstances:
- where there has been an overpayment of the contribution, in which case the amount overpaid will be refunded
 - where payment of the contribution is made because the OFT gave incorrect information, in which case the full contribution paid will be refunded
 - where the application is withdrawn or refused for whatever reason, in which case the full contribution paid will be refunded
 - where the application or the applicant falls into paragraph 4 and so there is no requirement to pay the contribution but payment has mistakenly been made, in which case the full contribution paid will be refunded and
 - where at the time of application the applicant is not subject to the compulsory jurisdiction of the ombudsman scheme as administered by FOS but becomes subject to it before, or on the day, its consumer credit licence is issued, in which case the full contribution paid will be refunded.
6. This notice supersedes General Notice 80 and has effect from 1 April 2010. For standard consumer credit licence applications, the charges will apply to all such applications received on or after 1 April 2010. For renewal applications of a standard consumer credit licence, the charges set out above will apply to all licences which expire on or after 31 March 2010 and which are due for renewal on or after 1 April 2010.
