A PROCLAMATION

DETERMINING A NEW DESIGN FOR A  
SILVER COIN OF THE REALM.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by Proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine a new design, hereinafter specified, for the silver Crown, being one of the silver coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five in commemoration of our Silver Jubilee:

We, Therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Our Proclamation of the third day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-seven, the design for the silver Crown to be struck at Our Mint in London during the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five shall be as follows:—For the obverse impression Our Effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS V. DG. BRITT: OMN: REX. FD. IND: IMP:", and for the reverse the image of Saint George on horseback, armed and with sword drawn triumphing over the Dragon, together with

the word "CROWN" and the date of the year "1935" and upon the edge of the piece in incuse letters the inscription "DECUS ET TUTAMEN. ANNO REGNI XXV".

2. This Proclamation shall come into operation on the fourth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this fourth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-five, and in the twenty-fifth year of Our Reign.
