The Civil Service Commissioners for Northern Ireland hereby give notice that the following regulations are published with the approval of the Ministry of Finance for Northern Ireland, and, in so far as they apply to appointments in the County Court Service, with the concurrence of the Ministry of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF CLERK (MALE) IN THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. The limits of age are 18 and 20. If a competition begins in one of the first six months of any year, candidates must be of or over the age of 18 and under the age of 20 on the 31st day of March in that year. If a competition begins in one of the last six months of the year, candidates must be of or over the age of 18 and under the age of 20 on the 30th day of September in that year.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's Dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the Ministry of Finance has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. A fee of £1 will be required from each candidate applying to enter the competition,

Part of the examinations in Physics and Chemistry will be practical, and part of the examinations in French and German will be oral. The practical and oral examinations will be held either during the course of the written examinations or immediately before or after them.

All the subjects in Part I. must be taken, and candidates may also offer subjects in Part II. aggregating marks up to, but not exceeding, a total of 1,000. Of the candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks in Parts I. and II. a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners in relation to the number of situations to be filled, and taken in order of merit, will be summoned to Part III. (Interview), which will take place at a later date than the other parts of the competition. The final list of candidates eligible for appointment will be made up by uniting the results of the three parts of the competition, and those candidates who secure the highest aggregate marks will be declared successful.

6. Candidates must obtain such an aggregate number of marks in the competition as a whole as shall indicate, in the judgment of the Commissioners, that they possess a competent amount of general proficiency.

7. No expenses in connection with attendance at any part of the competition will be allowed.

8. Successful candidates will be required to furnish satisfactory evidence respecting age, physical fitness, and character.

9. From the list resulting from an examination will be filled (provided there be candidates duly qualified) the vacancies that have been announced when the result is ready for issue, and such additional vacancies, if any, as it may be decided to fill.

It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the re-quirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

The Commissioners further give notice of a Competition to be held under the foregoing Regulations, the written examinations commencing in Belfast on the 16th September, 1935.

No person will be admitted to the Competition from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received on or before the 31st July, 1935, an application in the candidate's own handwriting on the prescribed form, which can be obtained from the Secretary.
