LINEN AND COTTON HANDKERCHIEF AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND LINEN PIECE GOODS TRADE BOARD (NORTHERN IRELAND).

The Trade Board established under the powers vested in the Ministry of Labour for Northern Ireland, and in pursuance of Section 8 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920, and the Enactments modified and adapted by the Government of Ireland (Adaptation of Enactments) (No. 3) Order, 1921, and any other Order of His Majesty in Council made under the said Act of 1920 for those branches of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods trade as defined in the Regulations of the said Ministry, dated 2nd day of January, 1922, hereby give Notice that they propose to fix certain Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers.
