and so on, in proportion up or down. No fraction of 3d. in the retail cost of the standard ration shall be taken into account.

A standard ration cost of 6/9d. per cwt. shall equal an initial price of 95/- for 1 cwt. of dried bacon and hams (provided fresh meats have realised 11/5d. per 185 lb. of pork carcase). For every 1/2d. change in the basic dead pig price per cwt. there shall be a corresponding change of 2/- per cwt. in the initial price of bacon and hams.

If the realised price of fresh meats shall be more or less than 11/5d. per 185 lb. of pork carcase, the difference shall respectively be deducted from or added to the initial price of dried bacon and hams.

For every complete sum of 2/- per cwt. by which the realised price of roll bacon and hams is above or below the initial price for roll bacon and hams (adjusted in accordance with the provisions of the preceding paragraph) 7d. per cwt. shall be added to or deducted from the basic dead pig price per cwt. as determined above.

The basic dead pig prices shall be ascertained to the nearest penny per cwt.

There shall be added to the basic dead pig price a sum of—

- 4/- per cwt. for each of the months January to April inclusive,
- 2/- per cwt. for each of the months May to August inclusive, and
- 1/- per cwt. for each of the months September to December inclusive.

The Standard Price shall be the resultant price obtained by adding the appropriate sum mentioned above to the basic dead pig price arrived at by the operation of the formula.

IV. PUBLICATION OF STANDARD PRICE.

The independent accountant and the Ministry shall communicate in writing to the Chairman and Secretary of the Council, the Chairman and Secretary of the Pigs Marketing Board (Northern Ireland) and the Secretary of the Ulster Curers Association, the prices realised for roll bacon and hams and for fresh meats and the retail cost of the standard ration not earlier than five days (excluding Saturdays and Sundays) before the end of the month.

These prices shall be regarded as confidential until the resultant standard price is published by the Council.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

AGRICULTURAL MARKETING (PIG INDUSTRY) ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1934.

DIRECT CONTRACT FOR THE SALE OF LIVE PIGS TO WILTSHIRE BACON CURERS.

Important Note.—No Contract may be made by the parties hereto for a shorter period than 3 consecutive months and no Contract may be made which does not provide for delivery of pigs in each consecutive month of the Contract. The form of Contract must be filled in and signed by the Producer and the Curer and sent immediately to the Board, who will forward it to the Council when completed. The Contract will (unless otherwise directed by the Council) not be enforceable unless and until it is received and registered at the offices of the Council within fourteen days from the date of signature hereof. The Council may refuse to register a Contract if there is any alteration in the print and if it is not received by the Council for registration at least fourteen days before the beginning of the month in which deliveries are due to begin. Ink or a typewriter must be used. Signatures must be in ink. After registration, one copy will be sent to the Producer, one to the Curer, one to the Board, and the original will be retained by the Council.
