HERRING INDUSTRY BOARD.

HERRING INDUSTRY SCHEME, 1935. DIRECTIONS.

The Herring Industry Board by virtue of the powers vested in them by the Herring Industry Scheme, 1935, hereby make the following Directions :—

- (1) No person shall between the 31st day of January, 1936, and the 30th day of April, 1936, cure in barrels any herrings which have been deposited or stored in brine in tanks or other receptacles.
- (2) No person shall kipper or process herring of any class whatsoever between the 14th day of April, 1936, and the 13th day of May, 1936.
