## CIVIL AUTHORITIES (SPECIAL POWERS) ACTS (NORTHERN IRELAND), 1922 and 1933.

Whereas by section 26 of the Regulations contained in the Schedule to the Civil Authorities (Special Powers) Acts (Northern Ireland), 1922 and 1933, it is provided that

the Civil Authority may by notice prohibit the circulation of any newspaper for any specified period and that the person circulating or distributing such newspaper within such specified period shall be guilty of an offence against the Regulations in the said Schedule :

Now, I, the Right Honourable Sir Richard Dawson Bates, Minister of Home Affairs for Northern Ireland, being the Civil Authority under the said Act, do hereby prohibit the circulation of the newspaper entitled "An Siol" or "The Seed," or under any other title or alias whatever in Northern Ireland, from the 4th day of February, 1936, until the 31st day of December, 1936.

##### COLERAINE GAS UNDERTAKING.

APPLICATION FOR SPECIAL ORDER UNDER THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920, TO EXTEND THE AREA OF SUPPLY TO PORT-STEWART AND OTHER PLACES AND TO OBTAIN OTHERS POWERS.

Notice is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland (hereinafter referred to as "the Ministry") by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Coleraine (hereinafter referred to as "the Council"), whose address is the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Coleraine, N. Ireland, for a Special Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") under and in pursuance of Section 10 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, and the statutes therein incorporated for all or some of the following, amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To extend the limits within which the Council may supply gas so as to include therein the area described in the Schedule hereto and more particularly delineated on the deposited maps.

2. To authorise the Council to borrow money and generally to confer all such further and other powers upon the Council as may be deemed necessary or expedient for affecting the purpose aforesaid.

3. To enable the Council to exercise all such powers within the limits mentioned in paragraph 1 hereof as may be necessary or convenient for giving effect to the purpose of the Order, and to confer upon them all such other powers as are usually conferred upon Local Authorities in connexion with the supply of gas.

4. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the Order, and to confer other rights, powers and privileges.

5. To incorporate with the Order with or without amendment or modification all or any of the provisions of the Gas Works Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, and the Acts amending those Acts respectively: and to alter, amend, repeal or re-enact, and extend to the Order (with or without modification) all or some of the provisions of the Coleraine Gas Order, 1934, and any other Act or Order relating to the Council or their Gas Undertaking.

6. To empower the Council to require where they think fit the use of pre-payment meters.

7. To make provision as to the maximum charge to be made for gas in the extended area of supply.

8. To make provision as to the charges to be made for gas consumed through pre-payment meters in relation to that consumed through ordinary meters.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the

Ministry any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Commerce for Northern Ireland, Chichester Street, Belfast, and dispatched on or before the 16th day of March, 1936.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must be forwarded to the undermentioned Town Clerk at the same time as it is sent to the Ministry of Commerce.

Printed copies of the draft Order together with copies of Ordnance Maps on a scale of six inches to the mile showing the boundaries of the proposed new area of supply and also the area in which the Council are at present authorised to supply gas have been deposited for public inspection at the office of the undermentioned Town Clerk and with the Clerk of the Crown and Peace for the County of Londonderry at his office in Londonderry, and with the Clerk of the Portstewart Urban District Council and the Secretary, Londonderry County Council, at their offices in Portstewart and Londonderry respectively.
