NOTICE is hereby given, that a First Meeting of the Creditors will be held in this Matter before the Court, at the Law Courts, Belfast, on Friday, the 28th day of February, 1936, at the hour of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon, for the Proof of Debts, and for the purpose of considering the offer of Composition which will then be made by the Bankrupt or his friends, pursuant to the Statute.
