Section 2 makes provision for the appointment of a Director of Legal Aid Casework ("the Director"). The Director's function will be to make decisions on the grant of civil legal aid in individual cases. Section 2(2) provides that the selection of the person to be designated by the Department as Director must be on the basis of merit through fair and open public competition.

Section 3 includes a number of safeguards to guarantee and protect the independence of the Director and the Director's decisions on the grant of civil legal aid in individual cases. Section 4 makes provision about the delegation of the Director's functions. Section 5 concerns the production of an annual report by the Director.

Section 6 introduces Schedule 2 which contains a large number of amendments to other legal aid legislation.

Section 11 introduces Schedule 3. Part 1 of Schedule 3 makes consequential repeals to the Access to Justice (Northern Ireland) Order 2003 and other legislation.

Part 2 of the 1981 Order is being superseded by civil legal services as the new legislative framework for the public funding of legal services in civil matters.

Initial determinations in such cases will be undertaken by the Department of Justice. A system of redeterminations and appeals is provided for enabling solicitors and counsel to challenge the remuneration determined in a particular case. Schedules 2 to 5 of this Order set out the levels of remuneration payable for the various categories of work involved, including the different forms of proceedings in each of the court tiers.
